Regrets Discussion On Tobacco Taboo

OTTAWA, Oct. 16.—While no wishing to appear critical, Methodist ministers in Ottawa expressed a diversity of opinion last night in regard to the ruling of the General Conference of the Methodist Church that divinity students be interdicted from smoking.

Rev. H.A. Frost, McLeod street Methodist Church, who was overseas chaplain, stated that he regretted such a discussion took place at the General Conference and thought that the conference could well have devoted itself to a discussion of larger issues. Mr. Frost stated that he did not approve of smoking by a minister because of the example it set to youths in congregations, but he did know that more than five ministers in the Methodist Church, as stated in Toronto despatches used the fragrant weed.

Mr. Frost said he knew many ministers who commenced the habit after going overseas. He did not think that the action of the general conference interdicting ministers from smoking would be actually a regulation. He happened to know several ministers in Toronto and in Montreal, holding responsible positions in the Methodist Church who were of the same conviction and opinion as himself in regard to smoking.

Personally, Mr. Frost said he did not smoke because he did not feel that such an example would be approved of by, perhaps, certain members of his congregation and because it would set an example to youthful members of his congregation. He preferred to take a broad view of the action of the conference.

Several other Methodist ministers whom The Journal had communicated with were out of the city. Rev. J. Calvin Field, of Westport, Methodist Church, stated that in the discipline of the church, it was plainly stated now that probationers must be questioned as to whether they used intoxicating drinks or tobacco in any form, and the negative answer was required of them.

Sudden Death in C. of Well Known Methodist Pastor

In the Oct. 1st issue the Daily Chronicle (Victoria, B. C.) says: A big section of the community today mourns the death of Rev. J. L. Batty, pastor of Centennial Methodist Church for more than three years, who succumbed shortly before 8 o'clock last evening from a heart attack. Mr. Batty who had been under medical treatment for some months, and had had two serious operations during the past year, was strolling in the garden enjoying the beautiful October evening, when he was overcome by faintness. He slipped into his study in the church about 7:30 and fifteen minutes later Mr. J. E. Redman, who called to see him, found him sitting in the dark evidently suffering. Mr. Redman telephoned for a physician, but by the time Dr. Raynor arrived he had breathed his last.

The late Mr. Batty was one of the most forceful characters among the ministerial brotherhood of Victoria and in the less than four years since he came to Centennial church had made a deep impression on the outlook not only of his own congregation but on a further big section of the community. A native of Yorkshire, England, he was 63 years of age, and was nearing the completion of forty years in the active ministry, over thirty of which he had spent in Canada. He came to Victoria from Winnipeg and immediately threw himself with energy and effect into various welfare and philanthropic movements in the city, showing a fearless spirit, a constructive outlook and an indomitable courage.

During the last year he had to undergo two serious operations, being a patient at the Virginia Mason Sanitarium, Seattle, for some weeks. It was hoped that his health had benefited by the treatment, but apparently not, although he had given no indications of his serious condition, only yesterday afternoon having attended a committee meeting of the Royal Society of St. George at the home of its president, Dean Quainton, and leaving for home about 6 o'clock.

(Rev. Mr. Batty was for many years a prominent member of the Nova Scotia Conference, and occupied several pulpits in the leading churches in that province. He was also well known in Charlottetown where he preached and lectured on several occasions.

Great Britain has Declined to Agree

(Special to The Guardian.) WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—Great Britain in a communication delivered today to the State Department, is understood to have declined to agree to the suggestion of Secretary Hughes for a reciprocal extension of the right of search and seizure, so as to give the United States prohibition navy jurisdiction outside the three mile limit.

At the same time the British foreign office assured the United States Government that every precaution would be taken to prevent violation of the United States prohibition law by rum smugglers under the British flag. It was said that Canadian and other port officials had been instructed to prevent so far as possible the issuance of fraudulent clearance papers and other improper practices complained of in Secretary Hughes' prohibition note.

Confined to Three Mile Limit

The British communication in reply to the one sent to London by the State Department several weeks ago, was presented to Secretary Hughes by the British Ambassador, Sir Auckland Geddes. Although department officials would not discuss the subject there were indications that the refusal to accord a reciprocal right of search outside the usual limits of territorial waters would be considered as finally blocking any extension of such authority to prohibition officers.

Orders already are in effect directing the prohibition navy not to operate outside the three mile line except in the case of vessels in communication with the shore by means of their own small boats and it has been the apparent belief of administration officials that no extension would be in accordance with international practices unless it were made so by some specific agreement as that proposed by Mr. Hughes.
