Nine Held in Theatre Case

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16.—Nine men were ordered held for the grand jury in bond of \$5,000 by the coroner's jury yesterday night in connection with the collapse of the roof of the Knickerbocker Theatre, January 8, resulting in the death of ninety-eight persons. They included the architect of the building, the engineer who designed the roof structure, the building inspector when the theatre was constructed, the builder of the theatre and others having to do with the building and its construction. The coroner's jury in its verdict declared that "collapse of the roof was due to faulty designing and construction and inadequate supervision in inspection."

GOTHAMITES SHIVERING IN AN ICY GALE

NEW YORK, Feb. 17.—Howling northward from some point in the ocean off Cape Hatteras, an icy gale struck New York tonight, sending the mercury zero and and bombarding shivering pedestrians with hard driven pellets of snow. At 10 o'clock the weather bureau recorded a still falling temperature of 9 Fahrenheit. With the prediction that Gothamites would shiver until Saturday—and may be longer. As a palliative, however, it gave an assurance that the peak of the windstorm, 56 miles an hour and passed.

Mrs. Asquith Pad Chat With

WASHINGTON, February 16.—The cab driver took Mrs. Margot Asquith to three different entrances to the White House before she arrived at the executive offices just in time to keep a half-hour appointment with President Harding this morning.
It was extraordinarily good of you to receive me," she said to the President as she swept into his private office, and then began a thirty-minute conversation on international affairs. The wife of the former British premier was admitted while members of the Cabinet were arriving for the semi-weekly meeting of the Harding of the federal family.
Mrs. Asquith emerged from the President's room in high good humor. She proudly displayed "the original copy" of the President's address at the closing session of the armament conference. It was a weekly meeting of the Harding of the federal family.
"Wasn't that splendid of him?" she asked.
"I'll show that to Mr. Asquith and ask him if I am not somewhat of a wonderful man," she went on, "so human, so easy to talk to."
"Such a magnificent head, bigger than yours and mine together," she gazed in apparent rapture at the top of one of the small portraits in the group surrounding her.
Mrs. Asquith looked up and placed a forefinger on her lips when she was asked if she had discussed the Geneva conference with the President.
"Now, I ask you," she replied in a confidential tone.
She had a little more to say about a controversial subject of longer standing when she admitted that a little had been said about the League of Nations. Almost in the next breath, however, Mrs. Asquith turned the interview to the armament conference, about which she said she discovered that her own views differed little from those of the President.
"It is vital to the peace of the world and the happiness of mankind," she announced, "that the relations of the great powers remain as they are today. Wonderful good was done at the conference and that will endure and more emphasized as the days pass."
Then, taking the President's manuscript in her muff, Mrs. Asquith left the White House for her next visit, which she said was to visit St. Gaudens's statue of "Grief," which Henry Adams had erected to the memory of his wife in Rock Creek Cemetery.

Hits Bride With Shoe on Nape Of Her Neck

In fact Eschert in his "Pillars of Hercules" states:

As she crossed the threshold he stooped down, slipped off his shoe and struck her with the heel on the nape of the neck. I at once saw the interpretation of the passage in Scripture respecting the transfer of the shoe to another."
"The slipper being taken off in doors, is at hand to administer correction. Hence it is used as a sign of the obedience of the wife and the supremacy of the husband."
