Every year the water highways are more fully occupied, and the tendency is toward a higher average speed. Nothing can be seen through a dense fog. Nothing can be heard with sufficient distinctness and certainty as to distance and direction to meet the demands of safety. The best fog signals in use repeatedly fail to avert terrible disasters.—Cleveland Leader.
