THE ANNUAL SCOTTISH GAMES.

From times long past the sons of Scotland in this Province have held an annual gathering in which the games, sports and athletic exercises of the Land of the Heather are perpetuated.

This is one characteristic of this strong and sturdy race, a race which thrives wherever it is planted, and in which no change of political conditions, no difference of soil, climate or social surroundings, can obliterate or weaken the tie that binds them to the land from whence they sprang.

Love and admiration for the home-land is not stronger, if so strong, in any race as it is in the Scotch. And yet the sturdy vigor, the native valor and enterprise of the race, has carried millions of them away from Scotland to the ends of the earth.

We started out to speak of the annual Scottish games which are to be held on Thursday next at Georgetown, but the pen has run away with us. Suffice it to say that these sports, the fame of which has long since reached to every corner of the Island, promise this year to be equal to, if not better than those of previous Scottish Gatherings in our midst.

A collision between trains running at high speed in opposite directions is a fearsome thing at any time. Scarcely has such an accident occurred in Canada which threatened greater loss than that which occurred beyond Regina, as told in our despatches, for on one of the fast-speeding trains was the Premier of Canada and several of his colleagues who are now touring in the Northwest.

The electors of the Third District of Kings will vote tomorrow in the election of an Assemblyman to fill the seat vacated by the resignation of their late representative, Mr. Morsion. The electors of the District are a highly intelligent body of men, to most of whom the rival candidates are personally known, we presume. They have also had the opportunity of hearing the political questions of the day discussed by the candidates and leaders of both parties, face to face in a series of public meetings.

Very fortunately, perhaps we should say providentially, no fatal accident occurred. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Hon. Mr. Graham and others were thrown to the floor by the shock of the collision, but neither of them was seriously hurt. Still it was a narrow escape from loss of limb or life. In such an accident those high in position are no more immune against serious injury than is the humblest passenger. The general feeling throughout Canada will be one of gratitude and congratulation that the Premier and his party, along with the other passengers on both trains, were saved from death, it was, apparently a very narrow escape.

We must infer that they are well instructed as to their duties in the premises. Every qualified elector ought to vote. If our people do not take enough interest in public affairs to cast their votes on a polling day our politics will soon go to the bad from such neglect. The hope of the country at such times rests with the men who will vote independently of either party and according to their honest convictions as to what is best for the country. Should any attempt be made to influence any of the voters by corrupt offers of money or whiskey we hope and trust that the offer may be rejected with scorn, and the offender delivered up to justice. Let the election be honestly conducted and the will of the honest majority will prevail and will be respected.
