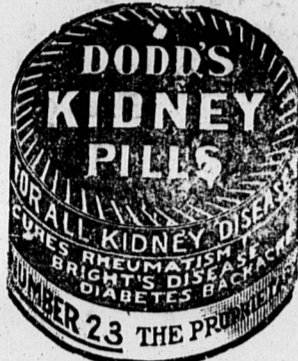

GRAND TRUNK RAILWAY SYSTEM

Its Rail and Water Lines Together Will Total 15,889 Miles. In 1909 It Carried 19,233,485 Tons of Freight and 13,916,147 Passengers.

Many people fail to appreciate the commanding position that the Grand Trunk Railway System, with headquarters in Montreal, occupies among the Great Railway Systems of the North American Continent.

From a financial standpoint, the Grand Trunk Railway System is the largest organization in Canada, and the one of the greatest in the British Empire.

The present total mileage of the Grand Trunk, including its subsidiary lines, is 5,400 miles, with a double track mileage of 1085, which makes it not only the longest double track railway under one management in the world.
