## Williams' Homer In Fifth Gives Anchors Margin Of Victory

Ryan and Williams were back in the fifth for two more runs when Ryan led off with a single and scored as Williams slashed his home run into right field. GOSHEN, N. Y., Aug. 6.—(CP)—Earl Rowe, 51-year-old Ontario farmer and member of the House of Commons, will drive his 60-to-1 red chestnut stallion Van Riddell tomorrow when 11 three-year-olds go to the post in the 21st running of the Hambletonian Stake, classic event of harness racing.

Next in line are Victory Song, 7-2, and Deanna, 6-1.

## Mexican Loop Still Going Full Tilt

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 6.—(AP)—The shine is wearing off the peace that brought more than a score of United States major league stars here to play baseball in the Mexican league but the league itself still is going strong.

Mickey Owen's jump back to the United States apparently doesn't disturb the Pasquels, the five brothers who dominate the game in Mexico. Gerardo Pasquel says he has heard nothing from Owen about leaving and he expressed neither surprise nor regret. Jorge Pasquel, who acts for the brothers, is away. None of the Pasquels talk much about their affairs, rarely even announcing the signing of an important player until he appears.

Owen's departure is the second jump from the league. Vern Stephens, St. Louis shortstop, played two games here and vanished. Whether others of the 25 major leaguers who played this year are sufficiently unhappy to leave is speculation.

Big salaries and bonuses attracted players here but some have suffered from the altitude (7,500 feet), others from digestive troubles. Signing big-name players packed the crowds into grandstands at prices generally above the average in the United States. Delta Park and Old Stadium was enlarged this year from 18,000 to nearly 30,000 capacity, counting the standing room. When Owen and others first appeared, the extra receipts may have paid the player's salary for months.
