MONTREAL, Feb. 4 — (CP)—34 cattle—Prices on all classes were steady with yesterday. Most of the cattle offered today consisted of cows of common to medium quality. Medium cows brought 9.50—10.50 and common 8.25—9.50. Canners and cutters ranged from 6—8. Common bulls sold from 8—10.50.

13—Calves—Veals ranged from 18 for common thin light kinds to 23 for good veals. Grassers were 10—12.50.

10 sheep—The bulk of the lambs offered were practically all bucks and common lambs, selling between 15—16 on a flat basis. Sheep ranged from 3—8.50 according to quality.

13 hogs—Hogs were steady at 28.50 for grade A and sows 19 dressed.

On the Maritime market Moncton hogs grade A sold at 24.50, B-1 28.10; sows number one 19 hot dressed weight delivered. Charlottetown hogs grade A 27.50, B-1, 27.10 fob country points.

Choice steers and heifers brought 18, good kinds 14.

No quotations on lambs. Sheep were 15 grade A.

Toronto continued at \$28.50 for Grade A, Montreal also \$28.50, Winnipeg \$27.50, Calgary \$27.50, Edmonton \$27, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon and Regina \$27.25, and Vancouver \$28 to \$28.60. Moncton paid \$28.50 for Grade A and Charlottetown \$27.50, the latter f.o.b. country points.

The above prices do not include the Dominion Government premium of \$2 per head on Grade A and \$1 per head on Grade B-1 hogs.

Western Cattle Markets
Western cattle sellers laboured under a dull market but prices showed little or no change. At Winnipeg the general range on good steers was \$12 to \$15 with odd transactions up to \$16.25, and the bulk of the desirable steers going at \$15 to \$15.50. Calgary opened draggy and a shade lower but firmed up later and good to choice steers continued at \$15 to \$16, while Edmonton paid up to a practical top of \$15.75 and odd \$16. Moose Jaw \$14.50 to \$15.50 and \$16, Saskatoon up to \$15.75, Regina \$16, and Vancouver \$16.25 to \$16.50.

Exports to United States
Dairy cattle exports to the United States in the past week totalled 828 head compared with 603 in the same week last year. This year's exports since January 1st totalled 3,642 and in the same period last year were 2,229.

Toronto Calves \$1.00 Higher
A light run of calves sold \$1.00 up at Toronto with choice veals at \$21 to \$23, while Montreal had a good demand at \$23.50 to \$23. In the West, little change was shown, Winnipeg paying \$16 to \$21 for best veals, Calgary \$13 to \$15, Edmonton \$15 to \$16, Moose Jaw \$14 to \$16, Saskatoon \$18 to \$21, Regina \$18, and Moncton \$14.
