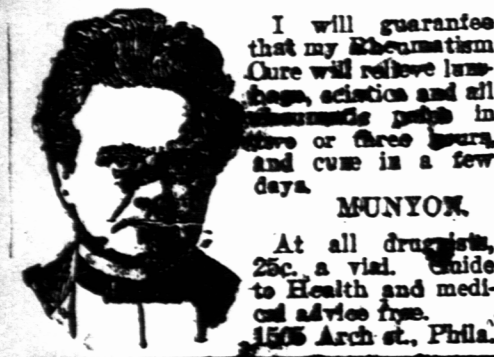

## GOOD TEMPLARS SPEAK.

The P. E. Island Grand Lodge of Good Templars recently in session at Murray River, as in duty bound gave expression to their views upon the governmental and legislative action at Ottawa and Charlottetown in matters pertaining to temperance. The resolutions reported by the Committee on Recommendations which resolutions were adopted by the Grand Lodge, appear in another column of this issue. They will repay a careful perusal as the deliberate judgment of one of the two leading temperance organisations in this Province.

The resolutions of the Grand Lodge deal with many questions pertaining to the promotion of temperance and prohibition, three of which have been so much discussed in these columns that we may here refer to them. One of these is the action of the Ottawa government in regard to the plebiscite. The Grand Lodge is "dissatisfied" with the refusal of prohibition, think the electors have been unjustly treated, and that the effect must be that voters hereafter will be "slow to believe promises made by public men and political parties." This resolution is entirely in line with the views taken by this journal in regard to the matter in question.

The Scrimgeour warehouse, and the action of the Federal authorities in granting special privileges to a notorious violator of the law are justly declared to "deserve the censure of every law-abiding citizen." We have again and again in the most friendly spirit warned the government that this warehouse is an outrage to the conscience of the entire community. The Temperance Alliance has enforced our remonstrance. The Grand Lodge of Good Templars now adds the weight of its condemnation. Will the Government now heed the warning?

Upon the License question the Grand Lodge has spoken like the voice of a trumpet. Long ago the Templars emblazoned on their colors—"No License in any form, under any circumstances for the sale of liquor to be used as a beverage." They are still true to that motto, and regard the Charlottetown License Act as "the greatest blow that could be given to temperance reform at this time." They regard the men who passed that act as the enemies of prohibition. And they commend THE GUARDIAN for "its masterly defence of our principles."

It is gratifying to the GUARDIAN to have its course thus endorsed by the very earnest and able temperance men who compose the Grand Lodge of Good Templars. The resolutions will add weight to what has already been said in these columns, and they sweep away as chaff is swept by the wind the last vestige of the pretence that

the temperance community of Prince Edward Island has consented to the License Act. The Grand Lodge has spoken clearly, and with no uncertain sound. Like the Baptist Association they have given to the license organs something that their most cunning sophistries cannot construe into anything short of plain, unqualified condemnation of License.

Our despatches tell that Lady Curzon's mother and sisters have caused serious disturbances in the social world of Simla. They insist upon being treated with all the ceremonial deference accorded to the Consort of the Viceroy. As the ladies in question are of American birth, hailing from Chicago, it might have been expected they would show more of republican simplicity in their tastes. But human nature, especially the feminine sort, is very much the same under a monarchy or a republic.

Hail-storms sometimes, but rarely do very serious damage in the older provinces of Canada. In Manitoba it appears to be different and the legislature there is about to create an annual fund of \$120,000 to reimburse the farmers for their losses from this cause. We have much to be thankful for in Prince Edward Island where we have a beautiful climate, a rich soil and exemption from cyclones, floods, droughts, and grasshopper, plagues, which work sad havoc in various parts of America.

It has been pointed out that back of the Dreyfus case lies the European spy system. Every continental power employs spies, even in time of peace to learn what the other powers are doing, to obtain the plans of their fortresses, the new weapons and war appliances that are being created, the secret intentions of cabinets and rulers. 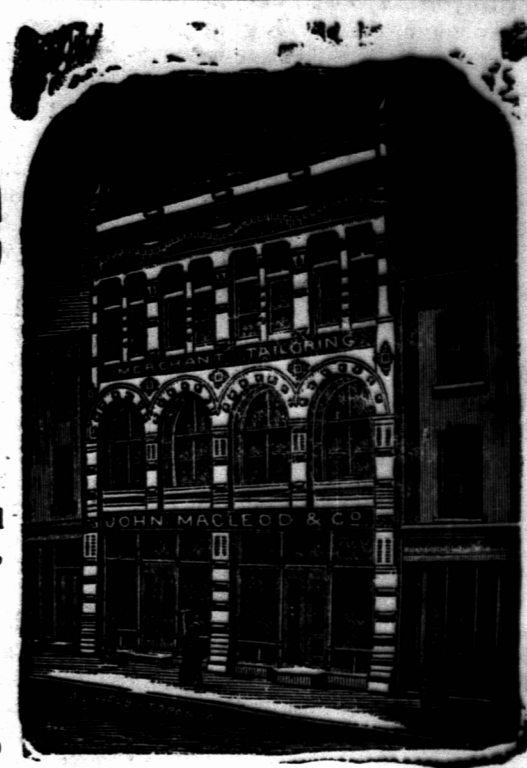

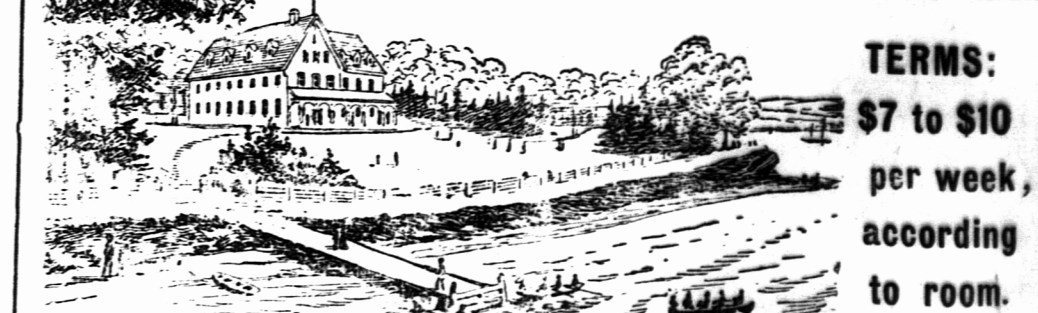
