OUR PROHIBITORY LAW.

We greatly regret to find that Mr. Whear has proposed to the Legislature to suspend the operation of the Island Prohibitory Law and make other provisions in lieu thereof. This is the more surprising from the pledge given by Mr. Whear when he became a candidate, that if elected he "would do all in his power to secure the faithful and prompt enforcement of the Provincial Prohibitory Law which comes into force in June, 1901."

Mr. Whear now professes great doubt and concern as to the validity of the Island Law, notwithstanding that he assisted in preparing the Bill which went before the Legislature and in which Bill every thing was eliminated that he thought in any manner exceeded the powers of the Legislature. True, the Manitoba Prohibitory Law has since been held invalid by the Court of that Province. But that decision, as is shown by the judgment of the Chief Justice, is based on the conclusion that the clauses dealing with the wholesale of liquors interferes with inter-provincial trade. It is well known that the Island Law avoids the very point upon which the Manitoba Law is condemned.

There is therefore every reason to believe that the Island Law is in every respect valid, as the Minister of Justice has unofficially expressed his opinion that it is. In any case the Government which proposed, and the Legislature which enacted the Law have good ground, and we believe have every disposition also to stand by the law and see that it is carried into operation on the date fixed for the purpose. It would be most congenial to the liquor interest no doubt, if Mr. Whear's suggestion could be carried into effect but it will meet with very scant sympathy in the Legislature, we hope.

This Province is wholly committed to the fullest restriction upon the sale of liquor which it is in the power of our Legislature to enact. The Province has warmly endorsed the action of the Government and Legislature in enacting Prohibition and it was one of the main reasons why the Government was so handsomely sustained at the polls in the last general election. To recede from the principle of prohibition would be a bold betrayal of the public trust and confidence which we are sure the majority in the Legislature would not for a moment contemplate.

The fact that one or more members elected to maintain the law now recede from that position should only strengthen the Temperance men in the House and strengthen the Government as well in their determination to stand by the Law, and carry it into effect. It is impossible to ride the two horses of prohibition and free traffic in liquors. Members will be held to strict account by their constituents in this matter, and the public will have no difficulty in rightly gauging their attitudes respectively. When it comes to a vote we shall know who are for prohibition and who are for the liquor interests.

The course proposed by Mr. Whear would be a cheap and indefensible surrender to the rum power. Let the Law be tried in operation and let the Courts decide upon its validity. It must be held valid until it is found otherwise which we do not believe will be the case. The decisions of the Privy Council heretofore have invariably tended to widen rather than to narrow the preconceived opinions of the powers of Provincial Legislatures, and

we venture the opinion that when another and fuller decision is obtained from that august body it will be found that the scope of our powers in regard to prohibition is considerably larger than we have attempted to exercise.

The important announcement is made that Aguinaldo has been captured by the American forces in the Philippines. He was captured on March 23rd some 200 miles north of Manila and has been brought to the latter port by gunboat. Aguinaldo was a leading spirit in the affairs of the Filipinos before Dewey went to Manila. At first he and his force acted in concert with the American commanders, but finding that the independence of the islands would not be granted they proceeded to make war on the Americans. Aguinaldo has been hitherto as elusive as Dewet has been in South Africa. His capture is probably the beginning of the end of the war in the Philippines.

Herman H. Cook whose charges are now being investigated before a Senate committee, was born in Dundas, Ont. in 1837. His business is that of a lumber merchant, in which he was very successful. After being an unsuccessful candidate for the Local Legislature he was elected to the Commons in 1872 and again in 1874. From 1879 to 1882 he sat in the Legislature and in 1882 and 1887 was again returned to the Commons. In 1891 he was defeated by the late Dalton McCarthy in North Simcoe, and in 1893 was again defeated by Mr. Bennett in East Simcoe. He then demanded to be appointed to the Senate but failed to secure the appointment.
