THEY'VE MET BEFORE
Goldstream Guards Band Have Heard of The Thomas Organ.

At the National Engineering and Trades Exhibition, held at Bingley Hall, Birmingham, last August, the Thomas Organ Co. were successful in securing a gold medal for an exhibit of their instruments, under the care of Mr. Paskell, the company's representative in the West of England.

During one week of the exhibition the Goldstream Guards band was in attendance, and it was a pleasure for Mr. Dunlop to notice when he visited the exhibition on the last day a large card placed on a Thomas organ of special design, and bearing the following:
