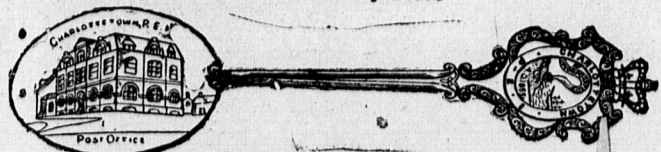

The edge is surrounded by two wreaths, united at the base, and the top is surmounted by a Maltese Cross. The space between the scroll and wreath is filled with pebble work. A neat clasp is attached to the medal, which will be a valuable prize for the fortunate winner.
