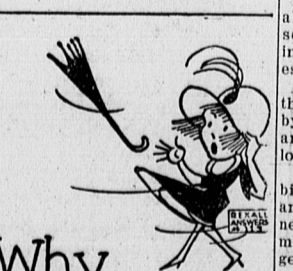

"No Mother to Guide Her" Proves Superb Photo-play

Presented at the Prince Edward Theatre last night for the first time, was "No Mother to Guide Her," a William Fox production, featuring Genevieve Tobin. Scheduled to run for two days, this production reveals with much simplicity and truthfulness the various paths trod by children of the rich and poor.

The sort of homeliness found in "No Mother to Guide Her" is reminiscent of "Over the Hill," another William Fox success, which was offered with great acclaim in Charlottetown last year.

In addition to Miss Tobin, the star whom Broadway has been applauding this year by reason of her performance in "Polly Preferred," the cast includes Lolita Robertson, J. D. Walsh, John Webb Dillon and Jack McLean. It is splendid in its entirety, performed with a fine restraint and high-strung sympathy. For purely technical merits, "No Mother to Guide Her" is excellent. Magnificent sets, both interior and exterior, together with much natural beauty, form an adequate setting for this appealing story. The hopes of each of the children, all of whom are ambitious, are stories in themselves. The director has entwined them into a single story thread from which the interest can never stray. To see life, as "No Mother to Guide Her" presents it, is quite helpful in guiding our own destinies. The mothers, daughters and sons, and fathers, who composed last night's audience, all found a direct message for them in this cinema production which is certainly worth seeing.

Man Who Escaped From Devils Island

(By Dominion News Service) EDINBURGH, Jan. 28.—One of the most remarkable episodes in criminal history is recalled by a claim made to the Edinburgh police by a man arrested as a suspected person. The prisoner first gave his name as Edward Thomas Garin, but after words claimed to Eddie Guerin, the man who made the sensational escape from Devil's Island, French Guiana, in 1905. The Edinburgh police, it is reported, believe the man's statement that he is Guerin.

The arrest followed an exciting scene in one of the leading hotels in Edinburgh the previous afternoon, when a woman visitor discovered a man trying to force open a trunk containing valuables with a chisel.

She called her husband, who closed with the man, but he broke loose and rushing down the stairway, dashed into the street. A porter then gave chase and after a struggle handed the man over to the police.

It has yet to be proved in court that Garin is none other than Guerin.

Querin was born of Irish parents in Chicago. He afterwards migrated to France, where he became associated with "Chicago May," a woman who was described some time later at the Old Bailey as one of the most notorious criminals in Europe.

The two were arrested in Paris and convicted of robbing the American Express Company of 30,000 dollars and of a previous robbery of 50,000 dollars, from the bank of Lyons. Guerin was sentenced to life imprisonment on Devil's Island, the French penal settlement off the coast of Dutch Guiana, where Dreyfus suffered so long.

For four years he suffered there all the horrors of the worst penal settlement in the world, and then, in 1905, he determined to try to escape.

He found two other prisoners of the same mind, and a confederate by some means secured for them an old dug-out canoe about 20ft. long by 3 ft. beam.

This was provisioned with some biscuits and a tin of corned beef, and one night, in the inky blackness, Guerin and his companions managed to elude the warders and get down to the water's edge.

Once aboard their frail and unseaworthy craft they paddled for dear life down the Maroni river. Towards dawn they landed and hid in the forest, and at nightfall paddled out through the shark-infested waters to the open sea.

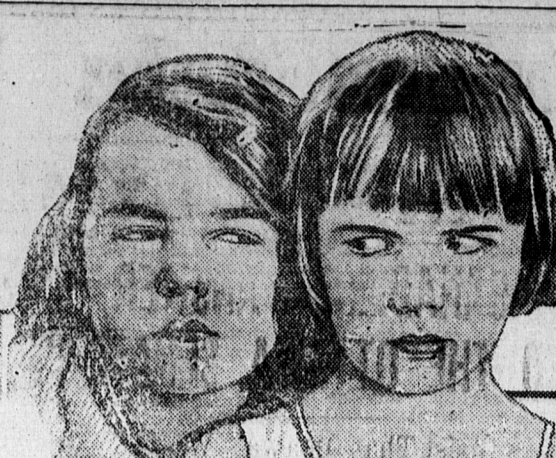
At dawn one of the men stood up, with the remark he was blind, and falling overboard, was devoured by the sharks.

The next day the others reached Dutch Guiana, lived in the forest for six weeks, and then reached Georgetown, Demerara, where Guerin managed to get some money and take steamer for New York.

Coleridge truly said: "They who indulge in it (Party) begin by loving their party better than their Church; go on to love their church better than their god; and end by loving themselves best of all, and now listen to what the Rev. F. Woodlock, S. J. has to say on the matter of re-union in reply to the Archbishop of Canterbury's letter on the subject of re-union: "Belief in each other's sincerity would kill the bitter bigotry which characterized so much of the controversies of the past and prevented the truth emerging from the conflict. When charity presides over the debate; truth will emerge from the fog which mutual distrust, so antagonistic to charity, has cast around it, and men of goodwill once again will share in the blessing of a UNITED CHRISTENDOM. Let us, then," the Rev. Pastor says, "eagerly welcome every undertaking for the common good of the world in its present state of need. Let us combine in work, meet each other without mutual suspicions and a by-product of our cooperation in charity may one day, in God's good time, BE UNITY OF FAITH." Now if men such as I have mentioned and living in such an old established country have received such a vision, surely those who are living in this new country who are seeking to prevent the answering of Our Blessed Lord's prayer must have their eyes holden or, as I have said, "They love themselves best of all." LONDON, Jan. 28.—The Canadian Government will not pay interest on the four per cent debentures of the Grand Trunk Pacific March first. This is the general opinion of brokers and financial men who for the past few weeks have been buying up customers with the news that such a payment is likely to be made by Ottawa. In anticipation of the interest payment of stock has been gaining gradually and steadily during the last few weeks but news of the final decision of the government which seems to have leaked through to London, fell like a bombshell on speculators and holders and there was a rush Saturday to unload stock with the result that debentures fell three points.
