SCHMELING KNOCKS OUT THOMAS IN EIGHTH

Chicago Boxer, Floored Seven Times, Proves No Match For Ex-Champion

NEW YORK, Dec. 13.—(AP)—Max Schmeling, former world heavyweight champion, stopped Harry Thomas, rugged Chicagoan, in the eighth round of a 15-round match tonight in Madison Square Garden.

ONE-SIDED AFFAIR
Thomas, bobbing up and down like a rubber ball from the impact of Schmeling's terrific right-hand blows, was knocked to the canvas seven times before Referee Arthur Donovan halted the one-sided affair, with only six seconds of the eighth round remaining.

Defensive Workout
Schmeling, grinning from time to time as he ducked or blocked his rival's vicious swings and lunges, indulged himself in a defensive workout until the final minute of the sixth round.
