GREAT BRITAIN TO MAKE EFFORTS TOWARDS PEACE

Proposition That Will be Submitted at The Hague Conference

PARIS, January 9. William T. Stead, the well-known English journalist, who arrived here yesterday, says in an interview that he is on his way around the world in the interest of peace. He further declares that he is authorized by the British premier, Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman to say that Great Britain, if no other country did so, would at the approaching second peace conference at The Hague, raise the question of taking steps to provide the maintenance of international peace. This, Mr. Stead said, will be done in the form of two propositions as follows:

First—That each country participating in the conference appropriate a sum of money to be used in the propagation of the idea of maintaining international peace.

Second—That each country participating in the conference render obligatory the observance of Article VIII of the act of the peace conference of 1890 permitting a third power to tender mediation without giving offense, between two disputing powers, and also that the participating powers extend the scope of Article VIII so as to bind the signatories in case of a declaration of war, not to begin hostilities for a fortnight, in which interim friendly powers would have the right to intervene in an attempt to adjust the quarrel.

SCHOONER FROM CHEVERIE, N. S. GIVEN UP AS LOST

The Henry Sutton, Captain Cole and Crew Not Heard From

NEWPORT, R. I., Jan. 6.—The schooner Henry Sutton, of Newport, which sailed from Cheverie (N. S.), Oct. 31, for Baltimore, with a cargo of lumber, before reported as missing, has been given as lost, with all on board, according to a letter received by the customs house authorities today from Captain J. C. Clifford, of Middleboro (Mass.), the managing owner.

BANGKOK BURNED LOSS SAID TO BE THREE MILLIONS

Chinese Quarters Were damaged Extent of Three Million Dollars

BANGKOK, Siam, January 9.—The Chinese trading quarters of Bangkok has been devastated by fire. It is estimated that the loss will amount to about \$3,000,000.

Bangkok, the capital of Siam, is situated twenty miles from the mouth of the Menam River. Many of the houses are built upon piles, a single raft frequently supporting eight or ten houses. Part of the city, however, is of modern construction, having electric illumination and electric cars, while lines of steam railway run in various directions. The business of Bangkok is largely in the hands of the Chinese, who are about as numerous as the native Siamese. The estimates of the population vary between 200,000 and 300,000.
