## FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

**C. N. R.**—Nov. net off 195 per cent and for 11 months up 29.9 per cent as compared with same periods last year.

**Perron**—Production Dec. 1 to 15 \$47,000 from 5,047 tons average \$931 against average \$10.93 in Nov. Development on 600 foot level has continued favorable.

**Steel Operations**—Estimated at 19.2 per cent on capacity this week lowest since Sept. 3, 1934.

**NEW YORK, Dec. 28**—Western Union Tel. Co. filed answer in U. S. District Court, southern district New York to government's anti-trust suit. First 68 railroads to report for Nov. net operating income 30.8 per cent lower than in Oct. 52.9 under Nov. last year and 38.2 under Nov. 1935. Gross revenues were 4 1-2 per cent under preceding month and 10.8 under like month of last year.

**General Electric Co.** has been awarded contract for propelling machinery for a second turbine electric 18,500 ton welded tanker to be built for Atlantic Refining by Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Co. at its Chester, Pa., yards. The contract includes both the turbines and the electric drive. Babcock and Wilcox Co. has been awarded the contract for the boilers of the new tanker.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 28**—East Malartic—Was continued 95.4 feet to 395.4 feet through ore of 7740 grade. Average values in this drift during its entire advance are more than \$1 better than the drilling indicated.

**TORONTO, Dec. 28**—Imperial Oil—Good progress may be looked for in operations during the year of 1937. In answer to an enquiry made by Financial Counsel, it stated that officially the consumption of petroleum products during 1937 has increased approximately 15 per cent and it is stated this contained at least its share of that increase.

Fair to medium quality cows made \$3.50 to \$4 and commons from \$3 to \$3.50 while canners and cutters went at \$2 to \$2.75 and common bulls from \$3 to \$4.

Good veal calves, made \$10, medium \$9.50 and common lights \$6.50. Grassers brought from \$4 to \$4.25.

Lambs were sold in mixed lots at \$6.50 while sheep traded from \$4 to \$4.50.

Bacon hogs, fed and watered, made \$9 while selecters drew \$1 per premium with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows brought from \$6.50 to \$7.50.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 28**—(CP)—Prices were firmer today in light trading on Canadian commodity exchange.

Butter spot—Que grass regraded 30 1-8; Que 2nds (38 score) 29 1-8-29 3-8; Que grass buyers-in-spec 30-30 1-4. Sales: 200 boxes Que grass regraded at 30 1-8.

Cheese spot—Unquoted.

Eggs spot—Ont A-large 26a; A-medium 24a; A-pullets 22a; B-large 20a; B-medium 20a.

**TORONTO, Dec. 28**—(CP)—In almost lifeless trading, prices ruled firm on Montreal open produce markets today.

Butter was quoted at 30 1-4-3-4 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 with lots to retailers at 31 for solids and 31 1-2 for prints.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 28 cents a dozen for A-large, 25 for A-medium, 22 for B-large storage and 20 for B-medium storage.

Cheese was 14 1-2 cents for Ontario white and colored.

Potatoes: No. 1 Que whites 80's 55-60; No. 2 80's 35-40; No. 1 N. B. mts 80's 63-65; No. 1 P. E. I. mts 90's 80-82; 80's 67-70; 50's 47-50.

**TORONTO, Dec. 28**—(CP)—Stocks went into a nose dive today on the Toronto market, led by the New York Board where depressing business news caused a selling rush.

Noranda weakened 1 1-2 and losses of 5 to 20 cents were recorded for the cheaper issues of the base metal group, including Almaden, Falconbridge, Sudbury Basin, Wainwright, Ventures and Bend Oreille.

The silver group turned heavy and closed lower by 10 cents for Castle, 10 cents for Eldorado and 5 cents for Trethewey. Incorporation held to the up side.

Selling was quite active among some of the golds. Dome, Lake Shore, Hollinger, McIntyre and Buffalo-Ankerite declined fractions up to 3-4. O'Brien weakened 45 cents to 5.15.

Aside from a drop of about 1-1-2 for Royalite, the western oils showed only minor losses. Calgary-Edmonton, Okalta, Anglo-Canadian and Home lost 5 to 15 cents.

## Currencies

**MONTREAL, Dec. 28**—(CP)—Pound Sterling firmed 5-32 cent on Montreal foreign exchanges today to \$5.00 to 15-32 while the United States dollar at 94 premium and the French franc at 3.40 cents held unchanged.

**TORONTO, Dec. 28**—(CP)—Prices broke anew in mid-session stock market selling today and leaders slipped as much as four points.

Expecting a quick turnaround, a few buyers returned to the market in late trade and some issues came back from their lows.

St. Lawrence Paper preferred, trading for the first time in a week, plunged four points to 39 while St. Lawrence Corp. preferred dropped two. In real equipment, declines of two points each came out for National Steel and Canadian Car preferred.

Fluctuating narrowly at the close, Dominion Steel B finished off more than a point at 14 3-8 while fractional drops were shown by United Steel, Gypsum, Canada Cement, Dominion Tar and Dominion Bridge.
