Mr. Scott was returned to the Legislature of old Canada in 1887. The writer of this paragraph had the pleasure of voting for him in 1871 at Ottawa. He has had a long, stainless and useful public career. The Guardian extends cordial congratulations to the worthy author of the Scott Act on his approaching golden anniversary. Ottawa we trust will do itself the honor of electing him as its next Mayor.
