ORANGEMEN OF CANADA.

The Grand Lodge of British America Meets To-day.

TORONTO, May, 30.—The stalwarts of the Orange Order are mustering in the city to-day for the opening this afternoon of the General Lodge of British America. The meetings are to be held in the County Orange Hall, on Queen Street, east, within a stone's throw of the residence of the Catholic Archbishop of Toronto, and St. Michael's Cathedral.

Last night the Grand Black Chapter of the Royal Black Knights of Ireland, met at eight o'clock. Major Armstrong, of St. John N. B., presided.

There have been many rumours of opposition to the re-election of the Hon. N. Clarke Wallace to the Sovereign Grand Mastership, but these are simply rumors, and nothing more, for no member of Grand Lodge will oppose Mr. Wallace, should he finally decide to stand again. So long as Mr. Wallace continues to guide the order as he does at present, he can retain the Grand Mastership until he voluntarily retires.

The reports to be presented to day will show a large increase of membership and a substantial balance in hand.

The City Council has voted \$500 for a public reception to the delegates, and the local Orange lodges will spend three times that sum for the comfort and enjoyment of visitors.

There are delegates present from Newfoundland and all the provinces of Canada. The Manitoba delegates are working hard to secure the holding of the next meeting in Winnipeg.

Summer Boarders.

THE majority of those—especially that great army of brain-workers in every large city—who leave their homes for a period of rest and recreation during the heated term each summer, prefer the quiet offered by the private boarding-house in the small town or on the farm to the average noisy summer-hotel with its continuous round of gaieties—where there is no rest for either mind or body—but who are often forced to take refuge in the latter, because of the inefficient service and restrictions in most country houses.

It is a mistaken idea that "city people" are hard to please and exacting. Quite the contrary, as a rule. The trouble too often lies not with the boarders, but with the mistress herself, who seems to forget that these people are not self-imposed guests, whose duty it is to conform to her ideas, but have come into her house and become, for the time a part of her household, at her own solicitation, and are remunerating her, at her own price, for any trouble they may occasion her. Such being the case, they have a right to expect from her, not only comfortable quarters and a sufficient amount of appetizing and nourishing food, but courtesy and consideration as well from her and the other members of her family.

When you voluntarily take strangers under your "vine and fig tree" at a stated sum, you may expect as a natural consequence to make some changes in the domestic routine of your establishment. You cannot, reasonably, expect your guests to conform in every detail to the rules by which you ordinarily regulate your household—herein lies the secret of the charge usually brought against summer boarders!

Banana Jelly.

Take eight nice white bananas and mash to a pulp with one ounce of sugar, three table-spoonfuls of apricot jam and a liquor glass of maraschino and another of brandy. Color the faintest pink tint obtainable. Take 14 ounces of best gelatin, flavor it with juice of two lemons, sweeten with loaf sugar, add a pint of water and cook until reduced one-half, or take a pint packet of lemon jelly, which can be purchased of any grocer, and dissolve with only half pint of water. When the jelly is cool, mix in with it the banana puree. It may then either be placed into a mold and turned out when cold or be arranged in a rough pyramid just before it sets and placed on the dish in which it is to be served.

POTTED HERRING.

To make this appetizing dish cut off the heads, tails and fins of six herrings, split open and remove the backbone, roll up and pack into a pie dish. Slice a raw onion and lay it over them. Mix together three table-spoonfuls of vinegar, two of Worcester sauce, half a tea-spoonful of water, a deserte-spoonful of brown sugar and a salt-spoonful of salt. Pour the mixture over the fish, cover with paper and bake in a cool oven for seven or eight hours, or until the fish are brown and have absorbed nearly all the liquid.

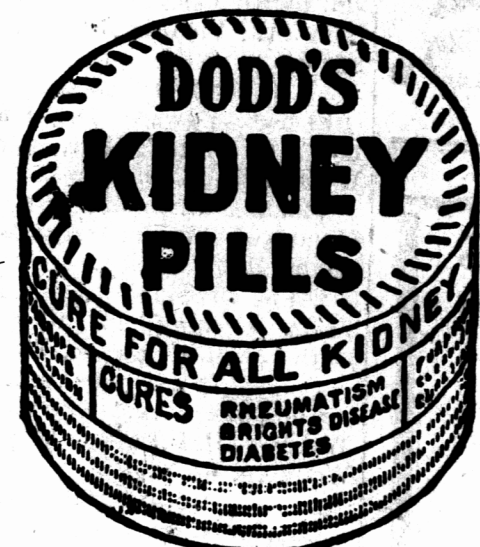

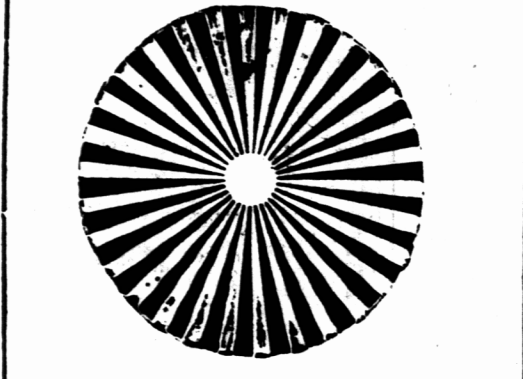
