from frost up to November 20th prevented that would otherwise have meant loss running into many thousands of dollars.

many ways, granted that there is the demand for good seed and that ours is as good as the best. We are up against a duty of 30 cents a bushel which is a tremendous obstacle.

The increased quantity offering each year makes it more necessary that we have a market for the surplus which is made delivery. The placing of a cargo of seed on a southern market which has been touched with frost before loading ruins our prospects not only on that cargo but for the future.

and to load them. It would seem, therefore, that if we are to continue in the potato business either for the seed market or the commercial market we shall be compelled to have proper potato houses from which we can at any time fill our orders and thus take advantage of the best markets offering.

In conclusion Mr. Boulter mentioned that a census taken at an agricultural meeting which he attended in Long Island, showed that the percentage of Island seed potatoes used there was greater than that shown by any other state or province.

Dr. Gussow, the Dominion Botanist, requested by the President to make a few remarks, said that he had been exceedingly interested in the address of the Secretary and that the things said therein had his hearty approval.

The Doctor stated that at the picnic and demonstration held during the morning he had learned that many of our farmers know almost as much as himself about the prevention and cure of potato diseases. He mentioned the order of the U. S. Agricultural Department which was issued about a year ago and which stated that Canadian potatoes entering the States must be certified.
