EASTERN NOTES.—The hurricane on the night of the 12th and morning of the 13th is the chief topic of conversation, and it is agreed on all hands it was among the worst that ever visited these parts. Though no great disaster occurred lots of minor accidents are reported. Fences were levelled in all directions, standing grain is tangled into an indescribable mass, rendering the operations of the binder insupportable, potatoes were blackened and turnips wilted, stacks overturned, barracks blown down, trees broken off, and apple trees relieved of their fruit prematurely. A new shop, building at Campbell's Cove by A. J. McIntyre was blown to pieces, the windmill of William Ford, was overturned, and lots of loose property belonging to fishermen carried away by an unusually high tide. Hake fishing and in fact all fishing has been interrupted, and will not likely be resumed till the arrival of the fall codfish on our shores. The great bulk of the harvest is yet to be gathered here. As our geographical position and an unusually cool summer has retarded the ripening of the crops. A considerable portion of the youth beauty and intelligence of Red Point and West River met at the commodious and hospitable home of T. L. Robertson on the evening of the departure of his sister, Mrs. Carney, and her husband Mr. Carney for their home in Boston, her uncle Alfred McLean who accompanied them was also present. He has been a citizen of the Republic for many years but has by no means forgotten his northern home on our Gulf-washed shores. Needless to say the hosts and hostess acquitted themselves in their usual agreeable way while the guests acted in that creditable manner for which our citizens are noted.

WORK is being pushed forward in the fitting up of the room for the Manual Training School in Queen Square school and it is thought that by the first of the month it will be ready. In referring to the use of manual training the Montreal witness says:—A growing interest has of late been manifested in art and manual training, not only by teachers and parents, who, as a means of development, see the necessity for cultivating muscular aptitude and practical skill in early youth, but by mechanics who fear that the general encouragement of handicraft work in schools will lead to two undesirable results, the multiplication of half-trained artisans and the displacement of men of superior skill. If there are teachers who think that it is a part of the work of the public school system to teach trades, crafts or professions that are to be exercised only by a part of their pupils, these certainly have not sufficiently considered the catholic character of public schools. But if, on the other hand, there are any who think that dexterity of hand and the alertness and precision of mental action that accompany such dexterity are insignificant elements of the preparation of every boy and girl for success, they have too narrow a view of life. It is a sign of the times that the authorities of the McGill Normal School have engaged one of the most enthusiastic advocates of nature study and of manual and art training to deliver to the teachers of this city two lectures on art, manual training and nature study. Mr. Tadd, director of the Industrial Art School of Philadelphia, will deliver the lectures, and will doubtless attract the attention of thoughtful men to the methods he advocates, illustrated by the success he has gained.
