(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Dec. 10—Firmness in the hog and sheep divisions gave Montreal livestock markets a steady appearance today with cattle listless and calves on the downside.

Receipts reported by Dominion Livestock Bureau were, cattle 1341; calves 98; hogs 674; sheep and lambs 423.

Hogs were selling at \$8.76 for bacon, fed and watered, with indications of stronger prices. A few lots were going for \$8.35 and select brought \$1 premium. Butchers, heavies and lights were cut 50 cents per hundredweight and extra heavies \$1. Sows ranged from \$8.50 to \$7.00.

Good ewes and wethers moved up 50 cents to \$8. Heavy lambs, were cut \$1 per hundredweight and culls and bucks, \$2. Sheep sold from \$2.50 to \$4.

Calves were slightly weaker at \$5.50 for grassers and \$8.50 for medium good quality veals.

Cattle were slow in getting started and no prices were established during early dealings.
