Town Council Hears No Coal In S' Side

Car Ferry Situation More Serious Than Many Think; Councillor Gorrill Declares.

There is not a ton of coal in the hands of dealers in Summerside, this was disclosed at the regular meeting of the Summerside Town Council, held last evening with Mayor W.J. Lidstone presiding and Councillors Gorrill, Mollison, Morrison and Wedge present. On motion of Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Gorrill, it was decided to authorize the town clerk to prepare a resolution supporting the resolution of the Board of Trade on the car ferry matter, and to have a copy of the resolution read to the Board of Trade and the authorities at Ottawa.

Councillor Morrison said that the matter should be brought home to the representatives at Ottawa and the assurances received that shortly after the war "we will have communication that can be relied on." Councillor Gorrill said that the boat was tied up again Sunday and that conditions are more serious than people think.

At the beginning of the meeting Councillor Morrison congratulated Councillors Mollison, Smallman and MacNeil on their return to office by acclamation. He said it gave him much pleasure to know that the citizens think so highly of them. The Mayor also added his personal congratulations.

Councillor Mollison in reply thanked the meeting on behalf of himself and the other elected Councillors and said it goes to prove that this council is not as "weak" as some people would like others to think and that they have the best interests of the town at heart and that by their resolution they are not trying to bring in more liquor to the town but to properly control the matter.
