Mobile X-Ray Unit Kept Busy

The 25 thousandth person to be x-rayed by the Mobile X-ray unit in Prince Edward Island was Mr. Fred Wood, Colman, Mr. Wood, whose family all planned to be x-rayed, was on hand early to assist the staff unloading their heavy equipment from the truck at Colman last Wednesday and was among the first to be x-rayed. In his opinion it is a good thing to know that all your family are healthy, and it would be a pity to miss the unit if the parents so desire.

The fact that 25,000 persons have been x-rayed since the unit began work in August demonstrates that the people of Prince Edward Island intend to take advantage of the latest in science to safeguard their health and are working to make our province a TB-free area for people as well as for cattle.

The Mobile Unit is now moving east from Ellerslie, setting up in various centres in Prince County which the people from surrounding districts attend. The Women's Institute in their homes, and organizations are insuring the success of the work by canvassing their districts and by procuring assistants in the clinic to fill out the permanent records which are filled with each film.

People are now being x-rayed through their ordinary clothes. This change in facilities operating and moving the equipment and it is decided convenience to those who possess the clinic. They are advised, however, so far as possible to wear light-colored, thin, and light-colored clothing which will not take a full breath.

It is most important that all the grown people in each district attend and be x-rayed both for their own protection and to safeguard the children. Ordinarily children below school age are not x-rayed, though if the parents so desire the unit staff are always ready to oblige.

Most of this survey are partly defrayed by the charge made, 90 cents per person or not more than \$2.50 per family of five or more. The balance of the costs is provided by the P. E. I. Tuberculosis League, from the proceeds of the sale of Christmas Seals.

Before the unit visits a centre, local institutes or other organizations make a canvass of the families in their own school districts. In this survey they use special cards provided by the TB League, and after filling out these cards the institutes return them to the organizer, Mr. Jardine. He retains half of each card, as an office record and mails the other half to the family whose name is written on it, telling them when and where to come for an x-ray.
