MR. FRANK KELLY

SHEDDIAK, N. B., Oct. 18 (Special) - Sheddiake and the community that extends along the Northumberland Strait shore, and many people in Prince Edward Island and in Nova Scotia were shocked today to learn of the sudden death early this morning at his home here of Frank Kelly.

A young man, but widely known in the fisheries industry, Mr. Kelly died with shocking suddenness. He had returned only recently from a trip to Prince Edward Island and was quickly stricken. He had been in apparent good health up to the time of his death. His funeral will be held from the family residence to St. Joseph church on Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. It will be a full Canadian Legion ceremony with the executive of the Sheddiake Branch of the Legion conducting the rites after those of the church have been observed.

Mr. Kelly was the son of the late John A. Kelly and Mrs. Kelly, and had recently succeeded his father as the Maritime representative of Simpson Roberts and Co., a member of the Liberal Committee and one who was deeply interested in his church. He was 34 years of age.

Earlier in life he was a leader in the sporting life of Sheddiake, being a clever and able player, and one of the first of the many Sheddiake yachtsmen when the Sheddiake Yacht Club was organized.

The war had hardly started when Frank Kelly enlisted in the Air Force. He served with it until June 1945 rising to the rank of Flight Sergeant, and having the reputation of being one of the best flight engineers in the force.

He had many friends and was well liked through his fine personality and through his confidence to the bereaved family.
