FROM THE BOSTON HERALD:—President Eliot's researches in the field of Harvard's vital statistics are well calculated to bring a blush to the cheek of the alumni of that institution, twenty-eight per cent of whom are unmarried and those who are married have reproduced themselves only to the extent of an average of two children each. And yet every class that is graduated at Harvard encourages early marriage and fatherhood by offering a cradle for the first baby born to any member of the class. It is no ordinary cradle, either. It is usually of solid silver or gold, and it makes a beautiful and precious ornament for the domestic sideboard. Besides this baby has no sooner emerged from its swaddling cloths than it is trotted out at every class festival, patted under the chin by each member of the class and told how much it looks like its father: The proud father is congratulated by his classmates, and the mother is made the recipient of floral tributes, with the compliments of her husband's old college chums. The boy, if it happens to be a boy grows up and goes to college, and is pointed out as the winner of the class cradle. If it is a girl, she is the pride and joy of the seminary. Surely it cannot be said that Harvard graduates do not encourage competition in increasing the population. The only tribute is that the prizes are limited in number and end with the awarding of the first one in each class. It might be a good idea to multiply them in order to encourage a corresponding multiplication of the babies, and thus meet President Eliot's criticism.
