AERIAL FLIGHT, HALIFAX TO QUEBEC

QUEBEC, June 8.—Flying before a strong east wind, Flight Commander Stuart Graham, A. F. C., accompanied by Mrs. Graham and his mechanic, passed over Quebec at 2.15 this afternoon in the fourth leg of his long-distance flight from Halifax to Three Rivers, which he reached safely.

As the plane approached the city following the course of the St. Lawrence, the hum of the powerful engine became plainly heard and crowds of people in the streets and parks gave the brave aviator and his wife a hearty cheer.

Graham was flying at an altitude of about 600 feet as he passed over the city, and favored by the wind was flying at a high rate of speed. He carried a message from Lieut-Governor Grant of Nova Scotia, to Sir Lomer Gouin. The letter was delivered to Hon. J. A. Tessier, minister of roads at Three Rivers this afternoon, and was handed to Sir Lomer Gouin here to-night.

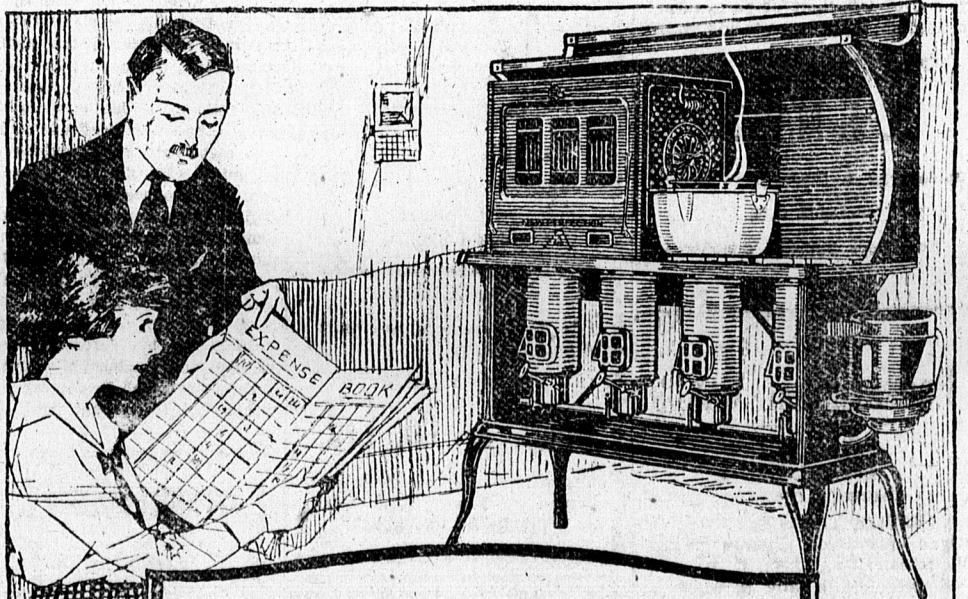

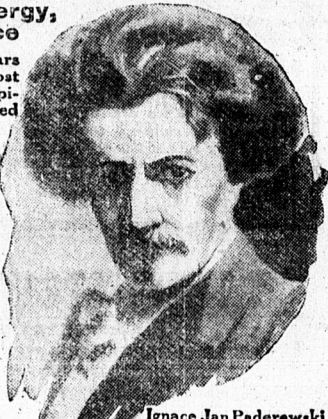
