

THE REDISTRIBUTION BILL.

OTTAWA, September 1.—In the house of commons to-day, on the motion to refer the redistribution bill to committee of the house, Mr. Tisdale will move an amendment to refer the measure to a commission to consist of the chief justice of the highest court in each province, for the purpose of having the boundaries of constituencies fixed, and having the number of members from each constituency determined.

CHARLOTTETOWN DISTRICT MEETING

Held In Brackly Point Church on Wednesday.

The Wesley Bi-Centenary Movement Considered—Public Meeting In the Evening was Largely Attended.

The Financial Meeting of the Charlottetown District was held in the Methodist Church, Brackly Point Road, on Wednesday, Sept. 2nd. There were three sessions held. Rev. Richard Opie, Chairman of District presided. All the ministerial delegates were present, except Rev. Joseph Parkins, who was unavoidably detained, and the Rev. Frank Frizzle, of Winsloe who is confined to his home through illness. After devotional exercises the Chairman extended a cordial welcome in the name of the District, to Revs. W. W. Lodge of Grace church, and Leonard J. Wason of Montague who were transferred to this District at the last Conference. Each of the brethren made a suitable reply.

The financial condition of the missions was then considered and the following changes were recommended to the favorable consideration of the Central Missionary Board, for grants, Winsloe, Vernon River, Montague, Scuris and Mount Stewart. While the fields of labour in the district present many encouraging features yet they are constantly weakened in parts by removals.

WESLEY BI-CENTENARY MOVEMENT.

The Methodist Church of the Dominion will during the month of October, celebrate the bi-centenary of Wesley, by a great evangelistic movement, and the attempt to raise the sum of a quarter of a million dollars, as a thank offering, to be used for missionary work. The district unanimously approved the movement, and passed a resolution pledging itself to do its utmost to carry the enterprise to a successful issue. Steps are being taken towards holding a Convention in Charlottetown, on Sept. 27, 28, 29th, which will be composed of the official members of the church in the two Island Districts. The Revs. Dr. Carman, Dr. Crews and J. C. Berrie, President of the Conference are to be present.

The Revs. R. Opie, Geo. M. Young and Thos. Hicks were appointed a committee to confer with the Chairman of the Summerside District and to arrange the details of proposed convention.

SUPERNUMERARY FUND

An additional amount of \$40.50 has been apportioned to this District to be raised for the Supernumerary Fund. By an unanimous vote it was assessed equally upon the circuits and missions.

Arrangements were made for holding missionary, sustentation and educational meetings during the year and the necessary speakers were appointed.

At 7.30 a public meeting was held which was largely attended, Rev. R. Opie presided. The devotional service was conducted by Revs. T. Hicks and S. H. Rice. Excellent addresses were delivered by Revs. W. Lodge and W. B. Thomas. The former gentleman spoke on the subject of the Missions of the Methodist Church and the latter on, "The progress of Christianity." Both themes were well handled and were much appreciated. The Rev. S. H. Rice was then called upon unexpectedly and delivered a neat impromptu speech. The choir under the efficient leadership of Miss G. Bryenton rendered several suitable missionary selections. It is needless to say that the Chairman presided in his usual genial manner and that the pastor of the church was well pleased with the success of the service.

A profitable District gathering closed with a vote of thanks to the Brackly friends for their well known hospitality in entertaining the District.
