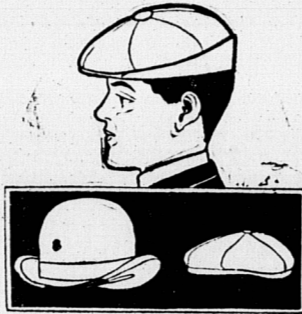

SYSTEM TO PREVENT FIRES IN FOREST

TORONTO, February 20. — From Hudson Bay to the Mackenzie River Valley, M. J. Macoun has snow-shoed his way for hundreds of miles through the forests of the north and—his word for it—Ontario and Quebec have a nice little problem on their hands to save their forests from the fires of miners, hunters, railway workmen and the general run of transients.

Mr. Macoun is connected with the Geological Survey Department at Ottawa and is attending the convention of the Forestry Association. Last summer he was delving into peat bogs in Saskatchewan for an American firm.

"Before the Transcontinental Railway is finished Ontario will lose millions of feet of lumber," he prophesied. "With a couple of thousand men working in the dense woods, scattered over hundreds of miles, what is to prevent it?"

The words of Aubrey White, a short time before probably occurred to both: "The thought of the danger of fire is enough to turn your hair grey." "I have suggested that a mounted fire ranger system be established along the whole route, with one man, say, every five miles," went on Mr. Macoun. "Let them patrol the 'tope' road that usually follows every railway construction for getting in supplies. They would need of course to be in telephonic communication, but this is nearly always established where a railway is being built. As soon as a fire starts the man nearest it could telephone along the line for

help and if he has the powers given in some other provinces he could force the railway gangs to help as well. At the best it's going to be a very serious problem." "You must remember that Ontario and Quebec stand alone. The difficulties of the others do not compare with theirs. No other provinces have the enormous stretches of forest, much of it almost inaccessible. There is no proper system of inspection of these fire rangers, but you would need an army of inspectors to cover the ground. To go up some rivers and back again, to reach a single man would take a whole season. It is true that the rangers are isolated and have practically no means of communication with one another. But how else can it be? You cannot build telephone lines through the forests of the north for the rangers alone."

OTTAWA, Feb. 22.—Justice Anglin, of the Exchequer Division of the Ontario Court, has been appointed to the vacancy on the Supreme Court Bench of Canada, caused by the retirement of Judge MacLennan. The promotion was first offered to Justice Oester, but the latter decided not to leave Ontario.

J. H. Bertram, Surveyor of Customs at Toronto, has been appointed Collector of Customs in succession to the late Peter Small.

RACE RIOT IN OTTUMWA.

OTTUMWA, Feb. 22.—The lack of a leader saved Ottumwa from adding another bloody chapter to the history of the race riots in the United States. A mob of one thousand gathered around the jail thirsting for vengeance on a negro who had committed an assault on a white woman. No man was daring enough to lead the mob.

RIOT IN SOUTH OMAHA.

OMAHA, Feb. 22.—Bent on avenging the death of Patrolman Lowery, who was shot on Friday by a Greek prisoner, three thousand men partly wrecked thirty buildings in the Greek quarter of South Omaha and created a riot during which two boys were wounded and a dozen others injured. The riots followed a mass meeting at which two State Legislators and the Attorney harangued the crowd. The police were helpless for almost three hours.

HARVARD HAS DEFEATED YALE.

NEW YORK, Feb. 22.—Harvard defeated Yale in a fast game of hockey in St. Nicholas Rink on Saturday night by a score of 5 to 0. Cyrus J. McMillan, of Charlottetown, P. E. Island, was the referee. Harvard meets Dartmouth College tonight. Harvard has the distinction of not having met defeat this season. Experts claim that they have the best team south of the Canadian border.

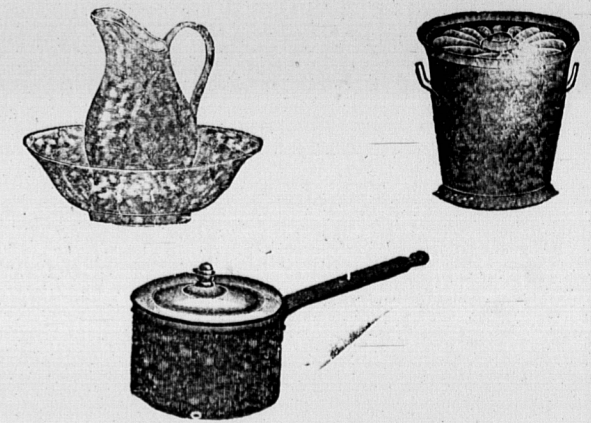
