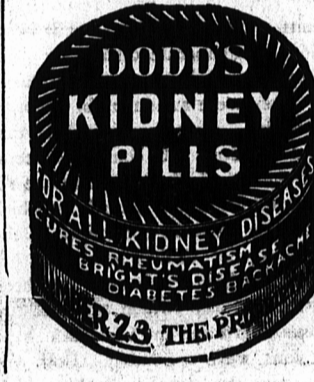
General Townshend At Constantinople
