BROADER TAX SCOPE NEED

REGINA, Dec. 17—The Saskatchewan brief for presentation to the Rowell Commission today contends the province would be \$2,800,000 short of meeting the cost of essential services even if relief were treated as a national responsibility (including relief debt) and the balance of the provincial debt were refunded at a 3-2 per cent. "Using a draft budget for a future average year in illustration, the brief claims it was impossible for the province to meet modern demands for social services on its present tax base, as laid down by the British North America Act. Saskatchewan's hope of discharging the functions of government lay in a readjustment of existing divisions of revenues and responsibilities between the dominion and the provinces, with the dominion taking responsibility for some social services and the province receive more revenue.
