## FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

**PITTSBURGH, Pa., Dec. 7**—For first time in months some of the steel mills are beginning to indicate that they might be interested in steel scrap at present prices. If scrap is a barometer in steel making as many believe this is first favorable sign of recovery in industry. Steel operating rate is holding so far this week in this district though new buying is slightly better. Current buying is reported for delivery in January and February and later, such as in rails, but there has been little of this type of business for December. In other materials orders for January are not very large and exist mostly because some consumers are expecting their inventories to be sufficiently reduced to require new material early in that month. Better feeling in connection with improved business after first of year has increased based to a large extent upon inquiries for heavy rolled steel products and expressions of opinion from some buyers of other products that they are likely to come into the market at that time.

**TORONTO, Dec. 7**—Shawkey—Robert Shawkey, president of Shawkey Gold Mines, interviewed following a directors meeting states the mine is looking quite well and Ed. Futterer, mine consultant, advises them on his last visit to property was looking better than any previous time. Production for November totaled \$41,000. The mill is handling at rate of 165 tons daily with costs \$5 per ton.

**TORONTO, Dec. 7**—Fanny Farmer—Directors scheduled to meet in Rochester today for dividend action. It is anticipated a substantial bonus will be declared perhaps as much as 50 cents per share together with regular 25 cents.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 7**—Announcement is made at Preston East Dome Mines that negotiations are underway with Hollinger Gold

Mines, which if completed will enable Preston to have mill up to 1,000 tons daily in the Hollinger mill. This will entail no change in Preston's present capital.

**TORONTO, Dec. 7**—Sigma Mines—Subsidiary of Dome Mines produced in November \$125,283 from 15,134 tons of ore. This constituted a new record output and compares with October's \$124,928. Se. t. \$121,069, August \$118,075 and July \$107,436.

**Brown Oil**—The central West Plank test, Brown No. 3 has passed into Brown Sands and is drilling within 300 feet of the lines. Lime is expected at about 6,400 feet.

**Calgary Wires**—National Pete No. 1 West Plank just completed will be arid shortly. National 1 flowing about 15 barrels an hour through large raising while hole is being cleaned.

**Dominion Coal Co**—Shipments to St. Lawrence River markets for 1937 season touched a new high at 2,715,000 tons, a gain of over 50,000 tons on 1936 season.

**Macassa**—November output \$130,917 against \$128,302 in October.

**Bralorne**—Output at new monthly peak of \$285,215 in November against \$261,800 in October.

**NEW YORK, Dec. 7**—There is no special overnight news which would have any influence on the market. According to Washington despatches President Roosevelt will hold his usual Tuesday press interview. Yesterday in the House of Representatives the compulsory control of wheat was knocked out of the House Farm Bill. The best that can be said about yesterday's market is that volume was comparatively light amounting to about 900,000 shares as against volume last Friday in the rally of 1,500,000 shares, however, we would expect irregular lower prices today.

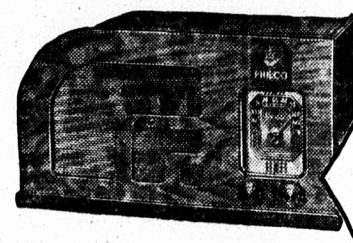
