Export Dairy Cattle (Continued from Page 6) shipped have not been taken from a herd already under supervision, a tuberculosis test will be carried out by the Dominion Government Veterinary Inspector.

Application for blood tests of the cattle must also be made to the District Veterinary Inspector and the name of the veterinary practitioner to be employed to take blood specimens must be given.

All dairy cattle for export are to be subject to inspection by an officer of the Health of Animals Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture. This inspection will cover such points as fitness of the animals for voyage, stage of pregnancy and general health.

Shippers are particularly warned against the inclusion of undersize, thin, slim or shallow cows which, in their colour
