**Find Union Guilty Of Violating Act**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (AP)—A final examiner for the National Labor Relations Board has found the International Typographical Union guilty of violating the Federal Fair-Hartley Labor Act by insisting upon closed shop conditions in the United States newspaper industry.  
In a case started nine months ago by the American Newspaper Publishers Association, examiner Arthur Left recommended that the five-man board order the big A.P.U. union of printers to stop insisting that the publishers hire only I.P.U. members.  
The recommended dismissal of a charge that the union violated the Fair-Hartley provision against "closed shop" is, according to the Board, the first time it will be up to the Board to decide whether Left's recommendations in this important country-wide case will be enforced or not. Even after the board ruling, the case can be carried into the Federal courts and may eventually reach the highest tribunal in the country.  
Saturday's actions by Left mean that the examiners now have found the I.P.U. has violated the Fair-Hartley Act in five different cases. In none of those cases has the five-man board made a decision or held any hearings.

Rye cutting is fairly general in all areas. So far the yields reported are quite light but the sample is good. The wheat harvest is expected to commence next week in Manitoba but not for two weeks in Northern Alberta. Warm weather is now required in all areas to bring the crops to maturity. It is expected that considerable of the late sown coarse grains in Alberta will be cut for green feed, according to the weekly crop report of the Department of Agriculture of the Canadian National Railway.
