G. T. P. WILL HAUL WESTERN GRAIN NEXT SEASON

Rapid Progress Being Made in the Construction West of Winnipeg 100 miles Nearly Ready Mr. Collingwood Schreiber Has Just Completed Tour of Inspection of line From Winnipeg West.

OTTAWA, Aug. 23.—"Canada will have a remarkable railway when the Grand Trunk Pacific is built," is the statement which was made this morning by Mr. Collingwood Schreiber, chief consulting engineer to the Canadian Government.

"I have just come from the West, where I have been inspecting the portion of the line from Winnipeg to Edmonton. I drove the entire distance of the route from Portage la Prairie to Edmonton.

"The surveyors have found a splendid line. It is practically straight, and the maximum grade to the eastward in four-fifths of one per cent, and westward five-tenths.

"As the Grand Trunk Pacific people expect to do about as well through the mountains from Edmonton to the Pacific, and as the national transcontinental surveyors have practically secured these grades all the way from

Winnipeg to the Atlantic, there is no doubt the line will be the best of all the transcontinental lines, and capable of the most economic administration and handling the greatest amount of traffic at a minimum cost.

"By autumn there will be over a hundred miles of the line west of Winnipeg railed, and there is little doubt the road will participate in the hauling of the crop next year. The settlers are going in with the road. Their shacks were seen dotting the prairie for the whole distance from Portage to Prairie to Edmonton.

"The company has sixteen surveying parties working to the west of Edmonton through the mountains. The contractors are encountering some difficulty in getting labor. However there is no doubt the road will be built in a very short time.

There will be a meeting of the Government on Monday. Sir Wilfrid will be present. Hon Mr Hyman returned to Ottawa this morning. The Governor-General also got back from Quebec.

NARROW ESCAPE FROM BAD HITCH

PORT HOPE, Ontario, Sept. 15.—Geo. W. Lawrence, of Oakfield, Tennessee county, New York state, escaped an unfortunate matrimonial experience here to-day which he will not soon forget. About a year ago he first met pretty Lillian Brown, of the same town, and a brief courtship of about six months culminated in yesterday being selected for the nuptials. The fair maiden and her swain chose Canada for the happy event and yesterday's boat brought them across the lake from Rochester to Port Hope. In the evening a marriage license was duly procured and the Methodist parsonage sought. Luckily the reverend gentleman was not at home and the pair were doomed to temporary disappointment. Early this morning they again repaired to the clergyman's house, and again missing him, they returned to have another clergyman's name inserted. In the early morning hours, however, the issuer of the license received word that the prospective bride had a husband and two children living in the United States. Post haste he despatched a messenger to the parsonage annulling the certificate and when the groom-to-be applied afterwards for the issue of another minister's name he was dumfounded at the news awaiting him.

CANADA TARIFF PLEASES LONDON

OTTAWA, September 15.—The members of the tariff commission are hard at work on the three-column tariffs. It is said that the present preference on British goods will be materially changed. On some items the preference will be higher than 33 1/3 per cent., on others it will be lower. Indeed the statement is made that in some instances the preference will only amount to 1.6 per cent., while in others it will be as high as 75 per cent.
