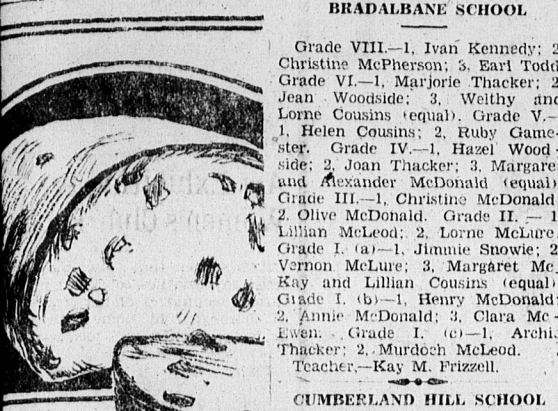

**SIR WILLIAM MACDONALD**

The following letter appeared in the Montreal Daily Star:

Sir—Having read in The Star of February 10, a tribute paid by Sir Arthur Currie to the memory of the late Sir William Macdonald, may I point out a fact not generally known that Sir William, although the maker of his own fortune, belonged to a most ancient and interesting family. Sir William's grandfather, Captain John Macdonald, of the Royal Navy, was awarded by the Crown an estate on Prince Edward Island, known as "Tracadie," which consisted of three or more thousand acres. Sir William's mother was the daughter of Hon. John Brocken, who in his day was President of Her Majesty's Executive Council of Prince Edward Island, and was also a large land owner.

A law made at the time of Confederation, compelling the land lords of Prince Edward Island to sell, at a small price, all but 500 acres of land, made Sir William Macdonald's family comparatively poor, as they had settled their vast Island estate at their own expense by bringing out settlers from Scotland. Many of these settlers were "Macdonalds," but they were not in any way related to Sir William, who as far as birth is concerned, enjoyed every advantage. E. H. R.
