**A Floating College To Sail Round World**  
NEW YORK, May 19.—A floating college with the wide world for its campus will set out this fall from New York City with 450 college boys to cruise the seven seas under the auspices of New York University.  
An 18,000-ton liner, which will be rechristened "S. S. University," will sail on Sept. 25 in charge of New York City Mayor LaGuardia. On the tour, lasting 240 days, the vessel will go first to Cuba, then through the Panama Canal to Honolulu and on around the world, visiting five continents, 95 countries, and 50 foreign ports.  
At each point the students will have an opportunity to visit the cities and parts of the countries, passing some time in Palestine, Turkey and Greece, and two weeks in Italy, England, France, and Germany. The students will carry on their regular college courses while on the tour, professors from a number of co-operating universities making up the faculty.  
Arrangements will be made, so that the ship will be comfortable for such a long voyage, and opportunities will be available for the students to meet officials in the various countries visited.

**Benes Unanimously Elected President Of Labor Council**  
(Special to the Guardian)  
GENEVA, May 19.—Foreign Minister Eduard Benes of Czechoslovakia was unanimously elected as President of the International Labor Council meeting here today. Forty-three nations were represented. The United States and Russia are the only important nations not affiliated with the International Labor Bureau. Workmen compensation was the most important question. The delegates lauded Benes as one of the great peace makers of Europe who they said, is sincerely attempting to put Europe's House in order.

**Germany Could Use 9,000,000 Beds**  
(Associated Press)  
BERLIN, May 19.—Sofia Gostze of the German Welfare Institute, believes that for hygienic, moral and social reasons every man, woman and child should have his own bed. She estimates that in Germany 9,000,000 beds are needed to bring about this condition.

**Quake Felt**  
(Canadian Press)  
WASHINGTON, May 19.—A pronounced earthquake was registered here today on Georgetown University eight gentlemen and eight ladies, 43 and lasted until 2.35 a.m. and it was estimated as 3,000 miles from Washington.

**East African Gold Strike Reported**  
LONDON, May 19.—A despatch to the Daily Mail from Darassau in Tanganyika Territory, East Africa, states that 100 whites and 14,000 natives are engaged in working what is described as the largest alluvial gold field in Africa, on the Lupia River, between Lakes Tanganyika and Nyasa, and that many others are rushing to the scene.  
Gold was first discovered in the neighborhood in June 1923, but the area now is being rapidly extended. All unclaimed rights have been reserved by the government.
