ROSEBANK FUR FARMS, LTD. A TYPICAL RANCH

The Rosebank Fur Farms, Limited, situated on the Hillsborough River, founded by Dr. Leo Frank, have one of the finest ranches in the province. The property is located on the east bank of the Hillsborough, distant from Charlottetown three and a half miles by carriage and one mile by motor boat. It faces Government House on the other side of the river, and covers an area of 20 acres, principally of wooded land, which affords excellent shelter for the fox runs. The ranch has been developed on the latest and most modern plans.

THE KEEPER'S HOUSE.

A keeper's house has been erected, a commodious dwelling consisting of seven rooms and a concrete cellar and completely furnished. The other buildings on the ranch include a large barn to accommodate two horses, a storeroom and an ice-house for the preservation of a fresh supply of meat from January to December. In this connection it may be mentioned that Dr. Frank has made arrangements for more than a year's supply of nutritious food for his foxes in advance, having contracted with Mr. Roop, proprietor of the abattoir, for cow's hearts, and with Mr. Daniel Jenkins for several tons of chickens' wings, necks, etc. He is also buying tons of smelts and special oysters, costing 7 cents a pound, from New York. So far as food is concerned, therefore, the ranch is exceptionally well provided. Four acres of land are being cleared especially for a garden for the cultivation of vegetables, etc., for the use of the keeper, and this, besides being exceedingly useful, adds to the attractiveness of the farm. Half-way back to the main road a wide cutting has been made in the woods to serve as a fire-break, which is an indispensable provision.

A WELL PROTECTED RANCH.

The ranch is as well protected as any property can possibly be, being guarded by two watch dogs of the very best type, one of which is a huge mastiff specially imported from New York by Dr. Frank. He is two and a half years old and is a thoroughbred animal and a prize winner. He is chained in the day and let loose at night, making the ranch perfectly burglar-proof.

Two observation houses are in course of construction, and from the windows in each of these houses the watchman will command a comprehensive view of the ranch and will be able to see instantly any intruder. Each of these houses will consist of kitchen and bedroom, both fully furnished. Dr. Frank, having, with characteristic thoroughness, attended to the minutest detail in every respect where the safety of the ranch is at stake.

RANCH HAS 72 PENS.

To come now to the ranch proper. There will be in a short time 72 pens,

for of which have already been built, while 32 are under construction by capable, experienced workmen. Dr. Frank's ranch has the inestimable advantage of being built on plans representing the acme of twenty-five years of experience in the fox industry, every conceivable device making for the comfort and safety of the animals being employed. One of the first and most important essentials to be kept in view in the construction of a ranch is, of course, sanitation, and every provision has been made in this regard. Not a single loop-hole has been left for disease, and a healthy, robust lot of animals is the result.

A UNIQUE FEATURE.

In the building the pens Dr. Frank has followed the advice of no less prominent an authority than Mr. Charles H. Higgins, the Dominion Government Pathologist, who came to the island some time ago on a visit, separating two pens by alleyways which are entirely covered by a quarter inch of concrete. This arrangement is placed in the alleyways and outside the pens, and should a fox escape from a den while the rancher is examining it, there is no fear of his roaming around the ranch and giving endless trouble, for he can go no further than the end of the alley. There is thus no danger from escape, and the rancher can go about his work of cleaning the dens without the strain of constant anxiety.

SANITATION THE WATCHWORD.

The drinking fountains are of the best possible type, and a regular supply of pure water is available. So far as sanitation is concerned, absolute cleanliness is maintained. The den is so made as to be absolutely waterproof. It rests about 18 inches from the ground and entrance is obtained from above. The den may be briefly described as a case within a case, the inner compartment being surrounded by sawdust. The dens are therefore snug and comfortable and no matter how rigorous the weather may be the foxes are perfectly safe.

THE BEST STOCK SELECTED.

Dr. Frank, in securing his stock, did so in a systematic manner, and his collection is the result of careful and minute inspection of and selection from the cream of the stock in this province. He visited upwards of forty ranches and was shown over the principal ones. Having first of all, after becoming interested in the industry, carefully studied the business and the requirements of the fur market from every point of view, he decided that silver foxes were in most demand. He then had the foxes selected by an island rancher, a pioneer of the industry. In the result the ranch has the pick of these ranches, and a sounder, healthier and more robust aggregation of foxes can not be seen in this province or anywhere else for that matter. Even on a pelt basis the business, as established by this enterprising foxman, will be a success.

SPECIMENS OF THE COLLECTION.

Dr. Frank's foxes, as stated before,

comprise the very best island stock, in his ranch being a nephew and niece of "Sir Charles," beautiful foxes; a son of "Sir Charles," a specimen that anyone might well be proud to own; a pair of pure Dalton animals; four pairs of "Patricia's"; two pairs of Silas Rayner; and one exceedingly beautiful fox for whose pelt Dr. Frank was offered \$750 by Mr. J. M. Hansen, representing Max Wolfsohn, of New York, leading fur brokers, for whom he has contracted for 550,000 worth of pelts on the island. Mr. Hansen, an undoubted expert and authority on the fur business, was greatly impressed by Dr. Frank's collection and offered him attractive prices for pelts.

Examination of the pedigree certificates reveals the fact that the foxes at Rosebank Fur Farms include such blue-blooded stock as Dalton, Oulton, Tuplin, Gordon, Rayner and Champion. As to markings, the foxes are of exceptional variety. Several are jet-black, with, of course, the white-tipped tail, while others are a variety of these two pairs. Of course, the difficulty of imitation, is a popular pelt in the large fur markets.

KIND OF FOOD FED.

Dr. Frank does not stick to any particular kind of food for his foxes, but gives them what, from experience, he considers best. He has two pairs of silver foxes of a low grade for the particular purpose of experimenting with in the matter of feeding, and any new food which he intends feeding to the foxes in the ranch he first tries on these two pairs. Of course, the Doctor knows before hand that what he feeds to the "experimental" pair is absolutely good, but to make assurance doubly sure he has taken the excellent precaution described. The fox runs, of which there are four, are spacious and the animals have ample room for exercise. A more strongly built ranch cannot be found anywhere, only material of the very best kind having been employed in the construction. The fence surrounding the whole ranch is very high and the wire used in it is of the stoutest make.

RUNS WELL PROTECTED.

The runs are also surrounded with strong wire which overlaps at the top to the extent of three or four feet so as to make it absolutely impossible for any fox to jump clear of the pen. The shelter afforded the runs is splendid, and beautiful groves around and about the ranch lend a pleasing touch to the whole. To ensure an absolute oversight of the ranch, in addition to the formidable watch dogs which are in themselves a sufficient protection, a clock system known as the "automatic system," has been installed. At various points there are boxes with keys, and the watchman on his round opens these boxes, inserts the keys in special clocks, and thus records the time of his visit. This is a method that cannot possibly fail, and any laxity on the part of the watchman is mercilessly indicated.

Between the fox runs there is a passage twenty feet wide, affording plenty of space for a team to go through.

DETENTION PENS.

In the front of the ranch there are

six detention pens, in which may be kept any foxes that are ill. This is a noteworthy feature and one that will serve a very useful purpose, as it is highly important that affected animals should be segregated. Up to the present the ranch, including the land, but without the foxes, has cost \$10,000. It is interesting to note that nearly all of the timber used was grown on the property, and excellent wood it is too.

TAMENESS OF FOXES.

A notable feature in the foxes at Rosebank is the remarkable and unusual tameness of the majority of them, a perfectly intimate relation existing between owner and animals. Dr. Frank, on his rounds of inspection, invariably carries with him tin-tits in the shape of candy, etc., and it is interesting to see the implicitly confident manner in which the foxes come to the exhibition of fear, eat from the Doctor's hands. The keeper is also on excellent terms with them and has no trouble whatever in his work, having a perfect control over every fox.

TATTOOING INSTRUMENT.
Among the appliances inseparable from such a business, there has been provided a special instrument imported from New York for tattooing the ears of the foxes for the purpose of identification.

The night keeper of the ranch is Mr. Russell Beer, a man who is thoroughly conversant with his business and knows all there is to know about foxes, and he and his family are now residing in the comfortable and attractive cottage described above. The day keeper will be Mr. J. M. Purdy of Spring Park Ranch, who has succeeded Dr. Frank's employment, while the general manager is Mr. W. B. Purdy of the Massachusetts Co., whose knowledge and experience in the fox industry is second to none.

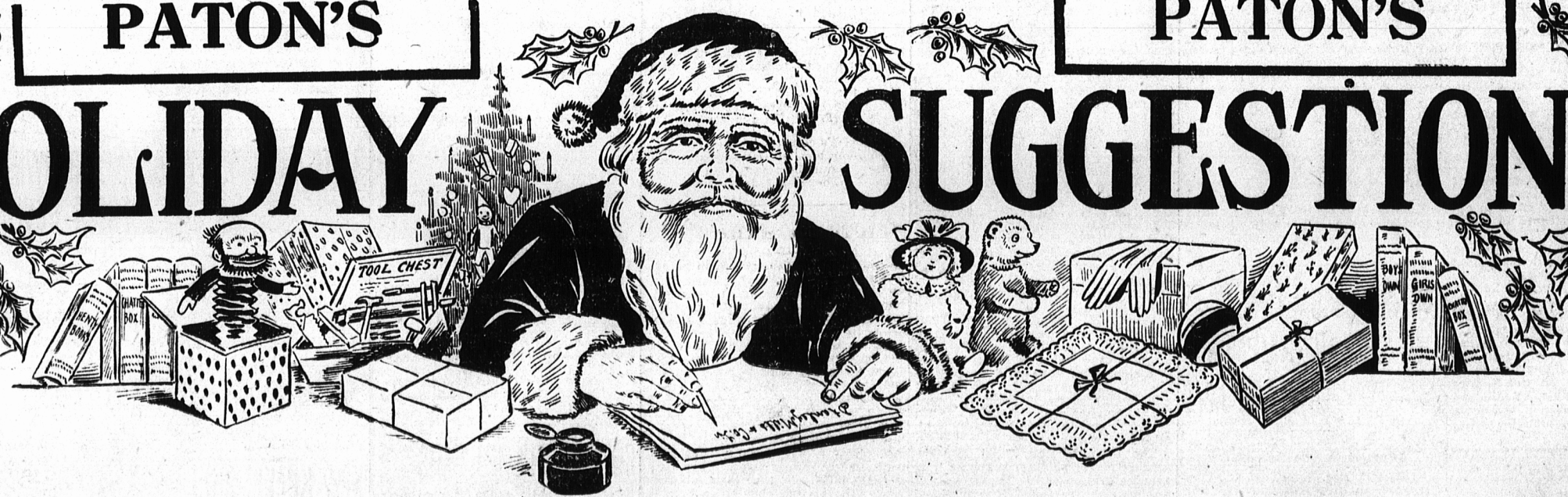
