THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.

The dreadful disease known by the above name entered Europe from the Levant in the sixth century and lingered in scattered localities for over a thousand years. London was awfully scourged in the year 1665, and in the meantime several European countries were desolated by the plague on various occasions. The progress of sanitary science in civilized countries has recently confined it mainly to heathen, or Mohammedan countries where filth abounds, especially in cities. It has been frequent during the present century in Egypt, Turkey and Persia. The plague broke out in the Volga district of Russia in 1878-9 and committed great ravages, but was finally suppressed. Within the past few years it has broken out with great virulence in India and is still rampant there. More recently it has spread to Australia, where the first case appeared in Sydney in January last, and has not yet been suppressed. Cases have also occurred at Melbourne, Brisbane and Rockhampton in Australia, and in Auckland, New Zealand.

More recently cases have occurred in San Francisco and there are strong fears that it may thence spread north and east through the cities of the United States and Canada. It is essentially a filth disease and revels in the slums of great cities. It is extremely difficult to extirpate where once it obtains a foothold, one reason for this being that the sewer and wharf-rats become infected and carry the disease from house to house, despite the utmost precautions. For this reason the Government of New South Wales has been compelled to take over the wharves and fore-shores of Sydney, burn up the rickety, rat-ridden, plague-stricken structures and rebuild all of the city frontages at a cost of millions of pounds sterling.

It is possible, though we hope not probable, that the plague, now so wide-spread about the world, may visit us here in Charlottetown. Be that as it may the fact remains that the sweeping plagues which afflict humanity—including cholera, fever, diphtheria and many other maladies—are bred and fostered by the filth of cities. Plague or cholera may not come, but no city can escape the penalty in some form or other, if its streets, yards and cellars are permitted to remain in an uncleanly condition. The warm season is now at hand when decomposition is most rapid. Let the Board of Health do its duty and let all citizens co-operate with the Board. Look upon the sanitary inspector as an angel in disguise. Even in the very centre of Charlottetown we are far too careless about our refuse; straw, paper, dust, the sweepings of shops, are thrown on the streets and into the yards, menacing health and increasing the fire risks, while in other parts of the city there is still greater disregard of the public health.

Keep the city clean, sweet, and tidy, not only in appearance but in fact, not only on the streets but in the cellars and yards, and if disease should come we shall have great advantages in our favor. It is necessary that the gospel of civic cleanliness should be both preached and practiced, and no enterprise will in the long run pay such splendid dividends as timely sanitary measures. If Sydney, Australia, had been wise in time it would not now have the plague fastened upon it and be paying millions of pounds to make a general cleaning up.
