A late Toronto Globe contains an excellent cut of Joseph Pope. In a sketch of him the Globe says: Mr. Joseph Pope, C. M. G., was born at Charlottetown on Aug. 10, 1851, and received his education at Prince of Wales College there. He is the eldest son of the late Hon. William Henry Pope, in his lifetime Judge in Prince Edward Island, Mr. Pope was engaged in banking from 1870 to 1878, when he was appointed private secretary to the late Hon. J. C. Pope, at that time Minister of Marine and Fisheries. In Sept., 1883, Mr. Pope was appointed private secretary to Sir John McDonald, and held that office continuously until the latter's death on June 6, 1891. He received the appointment of Assistant Clerk of the Privy Council Nov. 29, 1890, and on April 25, 1896, was promoted to be Under Secretary of State and Deputy Registrar-General. He is the author of "The Life of Sir John A. Macdonald and other works. He was identified with the Behring Sea Commission and the Joint High Commission in an official capacity, and helped to plan arrangements connected with the visit of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York to Canada in 1901. For this he was created a C. M. G.
