COMPULSORY BATHING.

The health authorities of the city of Aurora, Ill., have scored a victory which is worth recording. For some time the death rate of the city had been high, and the contagious disease and reports far from encouraging. A large number of the inhabitants of Aurora are Hungarians, Roumanians, Lithuanians, Slavs and Mexicans in the laboring classes, and it was among them and in their districts that infection spread and the death rate was high. Recently the health authorities, acting in conjunction with the police department, issued an order that every resident of Aurora must take at least one bath per week or be locked up. The police were instructed to see that the order was carried out, and long terms of imprisonment were promulgated to any who dared to go longer than one week without one good tubbing. The order had the desired effect. Not only have the police not found it necessary to make any arrests because of defiance of the order, but the health of the residents has improved greatly, and a welcome reduction in the death rate is looked for in consequence.
