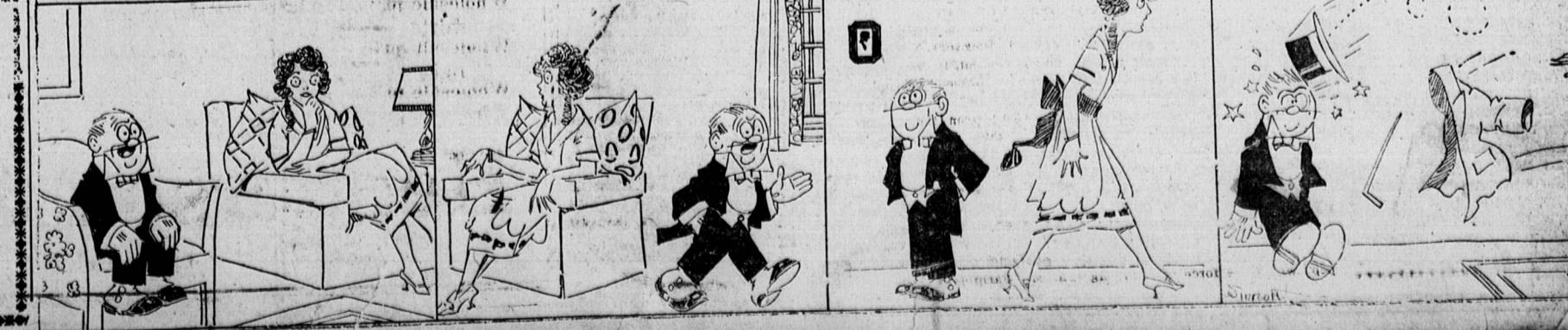
DICKY DIPPY'S DIARY.

ROTARY LUNCHEON—Rotarians held their regular weekly luncheon at the Country Club yesterday, with Secretary Percy W. Rogers presiding. Rotarian H. R. Rogers, Superintendent of Education, addressed the Club on the development of story telling in early times, how stories grew about the persons of national heroes, and how they were used to vary from time to time. The story of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table was given as an example. The outline of these tales was handed down from Geoffrey of Monmouth in the reign of King Henry 1st in his history of the Kings of the Britons. Additions were made by Wace, Round Table and by Map, who added the legend of the Holy Grail. William Caxton, the first English printer, published in the latter part of the 15th Century, Sir Thomas Malory's work which remains as the most important source of the Arthurian legends. In the Victorian age Lady Charlotte Guest with the assistance of Welsh scholars translated the Welsh manuscript giving further details of the exploits of Welsh heroes under the name of the Mabinogion. Tennyson drew from these sources in writing the Idyls of the King. Early in his literary career he wrote a poem on the death of Arthur, many years afterwards incorporated with considerable additions in his poem called The Passing of Arthur which forms the 12th part of the Idyls. Mr. Rogers concluded his address with a brief outline of the story of Gareth and Lysette, explaining its allegorical meaning. The thanks of the Rotary Club was extended to the speaker by Secretary Turner.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. LEONARD GORMAN.

A sad gloom was cast over St. Charles and vicinity on the morning of May 1st, when Mrs. Leonard Gorman passed to her eternal reward at the early age of 25 years. The deceased was in the best of health till a day previous to her death, when she was stricken ill. All that medical skill and tender care could do had been done but of no avail. She was attended in her illness by her physicians, Dr. Sullivan, Dr. R. J. McDonald and Dr. D. E. Morris and her pastor, Rev. E. C. McPherson, who administered to her the last rights of the Holy Catholic Church and was at her bedside when she breathed her last. She was a daughter of Mrs. and Mr. Patrick McGee of Sturgeon where she was born and educated, sent to P. W. College and then took up her position as teacher in Little River where she had been a successful teacher for four years, after which she took to herself a loving husband on July 21st, 1920. During her short married life she had won for herself a great host of friends who are left to cherish the memory of a kind and loving friend.

There are left to mourn besides her grief stricken husband, her mother and father, five sisters, Elizabeth of P'earden Hotel, Charlottetown, Kathleen, teacher at Glenfanning and Cecelia, Margaret and Mamie, also two brothers, Augustine and Thomas at home. Her funeral to St. Charles Cemetery was largely attended where a requiem High Mass was sung by her Pastor, Rev. K. C. McPherson, after which all that was loving was laid to rest in the adjoining cemetery, where her soul awaits that final resurrection. The pall bearers were Messrs. John and James McSweeney, Emmanuel Gorman, Barnet Hughes, Nick Landrigan and Maurice Daly.
