A Grave Charge Against Policeman

A case came up before the Stipendiary Magistrate yesterday in which considerable public interest has been manifested during the past few days, but which, to the disappointment of many, did not receive a hearing. The case arose out of a charge made by M. J. Murphy in a letter to the Mayor stating that Policeman Higgins had for some time past accepted from him a monthly fee on the understanding that he, the policeman, should warn him of any pending legal action or raid against him. Murphy further charged that when he refused to be bled further, Higgins allowed a raid to be made upon him with the result that he was caught unprepared, liquor was found on his premises and he was fined for violation of the Prohibition Act. The Mayor placed the letter in the hands of the Stipendiary and the matter was to have been investigated yesterday at 4 o'clock. Mr. W. E. Bentley, K.C., appeared on behalf of Murphy. The Stipendiary stated that he had the power of dismissing a policeman although he had no power of appointment, that the proposed investigation was not in any way a formal investigation under any statute or any formal procedure, but was simply taken up by him to see if on the charges made, the officer was fit to remain on the force. The officer, in face of the charges, had handed in his resignation, without attempting to justify himself. That disposed of the affair as far as the Stipendiary had to do with keeping Higgins on the force. Any further action would, of necessity, have to be taken in another and formal manner according to law. In the public interest it is to be hoped the matter will not be allowed to drop here and it is for the Mayor and City Council to take the further action necessary with as little delay as possible.

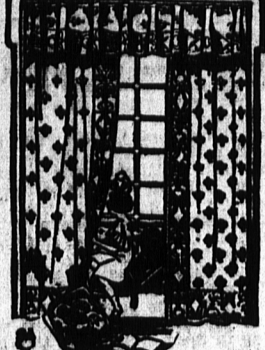
