THE INFALLIBILITY OF POLITICAL PARTIES.

It is a mistake to suppose that only His Holiness, the Pope, claims infallibility and he only in regard to matters of faith and duty. There is the infallibility of political parties and their leaders to be considered. This is an altogether wonderful thing, but it seems to be cherished by our legislators with true-hearted devotion. They see eye to eye in matters political, each party after its kind. Fifteen men on one side, thirteen on the other, are bound to view every question, the fifteen from one viewpoint, the thirteen from the opposite viewpoint. It may be a question of law, or of public policy, of procedure, of expenditure, a point of order, or of courtesy in debate, or other matters, relevant or irrelevant. It matters not that last year or the year before the fifteen or the thirteen saw things differently from what they see them today, and are on record in that fashion. The viewpoint of today must be one, within the party. The fifteen had rather disagree with their own record than to agree with the thirteen today. The thirteen are bound to see things differently from the fifteen, even if the fifteen today see things as the thirteen saw them yesterday. The main thing is that the two parties shall stand opposed, and that each shall stand solidly together. It would be rank political heresy for the fifteen to agree with the thirteen. And this has its advantages. The observer or the idle spectator always knows in advance what the vote will be. The vote will be fifteen to thirteen

The death of Carroll Ryan, editor, poet and author, took place in Montreal the other day, much to the regret of the wide circle in which he was known. He was long editor of the Ottawa Free Press and had served on the editorial staff of the Montreal Witness and other journals. His literary remains include a volume of creditable poetry, and other works. The leading journals of Central Canada pay warm and deserved tributes to his memory.

RAILWAY TRAINMEN WILL VOTE ON STRIKE

CLEVELAND, Ohio, March 30.—A strike vote was ordered today on the Lake Shore, Michigan Southern Railroad, by the officers of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen and the Order of Railway Conductors. The order followed the breaking off of the negotiations which have been carried on with the road for the last three days. About 20,000 men are involved. The negotiations ended with the rejection by the union officials of a counter-proposition which had been offered by the railroad. The original demands of the men were rejected a couple of days ago. The result of the strike vote will be known on April 8.

While neither side will discuss the causes of the failure to agree, it is understood that the break occurred on the question of working conditions both sides being willing to compromise on the subject of working conditions.

PINEAPPLE PRICK WAS FATAL

NEW YORK, March 30.—Mrs. Helen M. Mitchell, a widow, living in Brooklyn, died today as a result of a speckle of a pineapple she had been eating, entering her stomach. The wound was a slight one, but in half an hour her hand was swollen. Her arm then became inflamed and turned black and green in color. The family physician was called in, but the swelling spread to her body, and the woman was soon in great agony and later died.

CORRUPTION AND ATTEMPTED CORRUPTION.

By a vote of 40 to 9 the Senate of New York State has resolved that Senator Allis is guilty of the corruption charged by Senator Conger. The result of this vote is to expel the guilty man from the House in which he has long been a prominent member. Very simple, plain and vulgar was his offence, taking a cash payment for supporting and promoting bills to the advantage of the contractors and corporations that furnished the money.

Shall we lay the flattering unction to our souls that such things are not done or successfully attempted, in fair Canada? Possibly we may, although the records show that some attempts to corrupt legislators have been made in various Legislatures and even in the Canadian Parliament in years past, ineffectually. of Toronto, in a recent issue, refers to the statement of Hon. H.R. Emmerson, made from his place in Parliament, that he had been informed of good authority that a fund of two million dollars had been raised to buy up enough members of Parliament to put through the Long Sault power project. If there is any truth or probability in this, which we do not know, there should be no time lost in getting to the bottom and making a thorough exposure of the facts.

The time that tried men's souls is sometimes spoken of as an epoch in the past. The time for the trial of the integrity and honor of our public men is still with us. Anything that is purchasable will be bought in these days, if gain can be made by the purchase. Corruption or attempted corruption in high places should be met by instant exposure and swift and condign punishment of the guilty.

March began and ended mildly this year as to weather conditions. But in the Legislature it came in like a lamb and went out like a lion. The echoes of the session yesterday morning behind closed doors were writhing.

Nova Scotia seems to be moving at last in the direction of Provincial prohibition of the liquor traffic. The end is not yet and we know that "the trade" will fight desperately when it comes to the last ditch.

Again there is tariff peace between Ottawa and Washington. Concession did the trick. Uncle Sam gives Canada his minimum rates and gets Canada's intermediate rate on thirteen articles out of twenty-five on which France is favored. It may work out all right. Let us hope so.
