NEW YORK, Nov. 4—There is widespread bearishness on the motors and steels, on the first because of disappointing business at the motor show, on the second because of sales resistance in motors and the slump in railroad equipment buying. Nevertheless, the market, if given another point or two of decline is likely to get into a temporarily oversold area and to stage a rally. I would expect such a rally to develop on further selling whether this afternoon or tomorrow.

TORONTO, Nov. 4—Heva Cadillac Ltd.—Courville Township Quebec has just completed a deal where Hevey Gold Mines will proceed on a working option. It is learned officially that Hevey has entered into contract to thoroughly explore the Heva Cadillac and if conditions warrant a new company will be formed with Hevey holding two thirds control under option prices that will carry it to production.

Aeroplane Contract—Dominion Government awards \$1,500,000 contract for 18 bombers to Fairchild Aircraft Ltd.

United Grain Growers—For year ended July 31 operating profit \$137,864 against \$81,690 in previous year and after all charges net loss \$125,321.

C. P. R. and C. N. R.—October combined rail gross over \$34,000,000 up 1.3 over year ago. Ten months gross up 6 per cent.

Montreal Stock Exchange announces new margin requirements effective November 1st.

Anglo Canadian Telephone—Capital rearrangements proposed. Plan to eliminate class B shares, improving position of Class A.

Abitibi—Preferred shareholders committee approve Ripley plan and intend to appear before court November 10 to support it.

East Malartic—To offer shareholders 1,000,000 at \$1 each, meeting November 19. One new for three now held. Company believes program of underground exploration will show possibility of milling on large tonnage basis and at low cost. Size of mill not decided yet.

TORONTO, Nov. 4—Paymaster—Established a new monthly production record in October when \$114,225 was recovered from treatment of 14,749 tons of ore for an average recovery of \$7774 per ton. In the preceding month production was \$112,726 which included \$7,076 from re-treatment of 667 tons of tailings.

Morris Kirkland—Reports production for October at \$16,670 a slight increase over the previous month of \$16,090.

Amn Gold Mines—Has informed Toronto Stock Exchange that it has arranged to sell 50,000 shares at 25 cents a share payment to be made immediately. Purchaser will be given an option to buy an additional 50,000 shares at 30 cents for a period of thirty days, proceeds to be used to deepen shaft and establish two more levels.

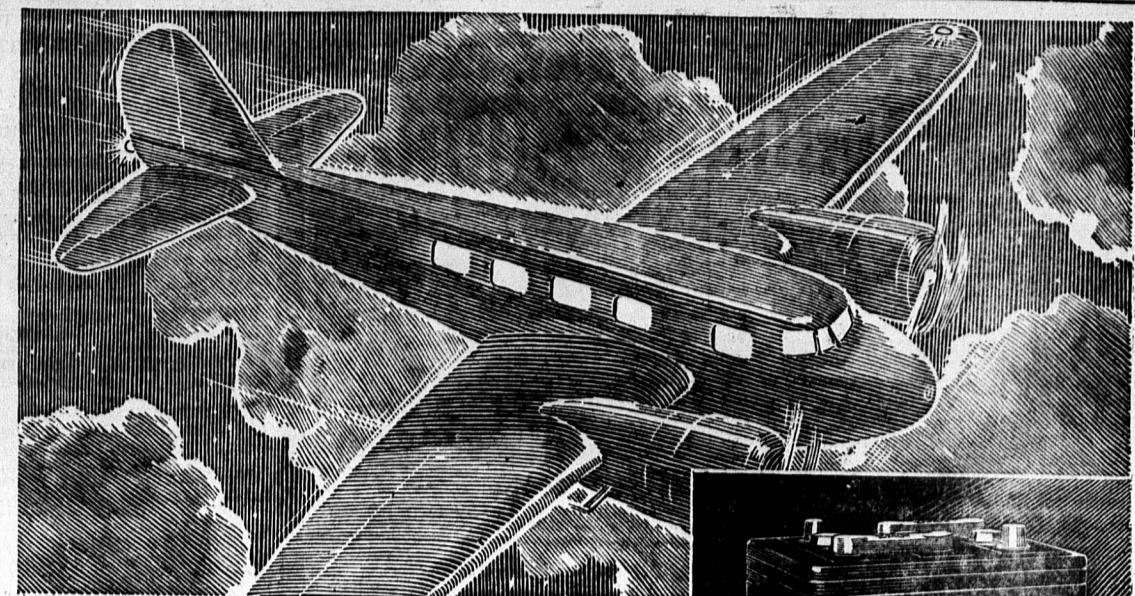

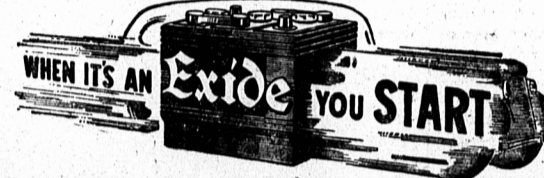
