SCHOOL FAIR AT TYNE VALLEY

Monday, September 24th, was an important day in the Agricultural history of Tyne Valley and vicinity, when the pupils of Ellerslie, Bideford, Northam, Tyne Valley and Port Hill assembled at Britannia Hall for a School Fair, the first of its kind ever held in the western end of this province.

The judging was done by Miss Grace Dutcher, P.W. College; H. H. Shaw, B. Sc., Chief Superintendent of Education; J. S. Tennant, B.S.A., District Representative for Prince Co. and J. W. Brown, Tyne Valley.

Prof. J. E. McLarty and Inspector Fraser had charge of the sports and other attractions, while the judging was being done.

The teachers, Miss Dinis, Miss Allen, Miss MacArthur, Miss Ramsay, and Mr. Hammill, all worked hard to make the Fair a success. Others also rendered invaluable assistance.

Grateful acknowledgment is made of cash donations (unsolicited) from A. E. McLean, L. McNevin, Daniel McLean, J. A. Stewart and W. J. Montgomery and of special prizes given by Mr. E. S. Reid and Inspector Fraser.

The programme in the afternoon opened with a Parade of Decorated Vans—one from each district. This was a commendable demonstration of careful planning and aesthetic taste. Marching and singing by the children came next, followed by the sports which were keenly contested. All winners—even the fat men—cherished their hard earned laurels, the prize ribbons.

After viewing the exhibits and listening to the different addresses, all returned to their homes well satisfied. A great many people are anxious to have the School Fair a permanent factor in the agricultural development of the community and arrangements are already under way for next year's exhibition.
