What Limits Profits In Sheep

Careful attention to a few operations in the flock during the spring months probably means more money to the sheep raiser than any other time or trouble he takes. And really at present depressed prices unless he is extremely careful, his profit will be pretty well "whittled" away by waste and market cuts on both wool and lambs.

Shearing should be pretty well cleaned up before this time. Some people apparently do not realize how cruel they are in leaving the wool on sheep in warm weather. As well it means a loss of both wool and flesh, which is money.

Dipping should follow soon after shearing, and most of the ticks soon migrate to the lambs so that everything must be dipped in order to make a clean-up. Liquid dips are the only effective treatment and directions should be followed carefully.

Dock and Castrate: There seems no excuse for leaving tails nor buck lambs in the flock when it involves such easy and simple operations.

Both should be done at 2 or 3 weeks of age, but lambs considerably older than this can be handled. Remember that the packers have announced a 2c cut on bucks to go into effect July 6th; also that uniformly docked lambs sell better on the stock yards, particularly where they desire to select out the ewes for breeding purposes. The knife is the best instrument yet found for both these jobs. Use a little disinfectant, a weak solution of creolin is good. Dock short at the second or third joint, cutting from the lower side of the tail. Use a little tar afterwards if flies are prevalent.

The other principal loss comes from marketing under-fleshed under-weight lambs. Lambs under 70 lbs. are cut by the packers and those under 60 lbs. go as culls at very low prices. As well as weight, a lamb must have finish. It is expected that the bulk of Maritime lambs will be sold on grade this fall and if this is the case the man with a thin lamb, even if it is all right for weight, will have to take a lower price, and the man with the good lamb will get a premium. After all this is the fairest way, and will give encouragement to those who are breeding and feeding the better kind. No matter what happens it will pay well to provide some supplementary pasture such as rape to finish on unless exceptionally good grass pasture is available. Grains can also be used to advantage.

FRENCH TRADITIONS PREVENT POLITICAL PROGRESS FOR WOMEN

MONTREAL, May 23.—If women in France were allowed to vote, the likelihood of another European war would be greatly lessened, Madame Juliette Veillier-Duray, of Paris stated in a recent interview here. Mme Duray, who is a prominent advocate at the Court of Appeals, came to this continent as the French delegate to the International Association of University Women held at Wellesley College, Northampton, Mass.

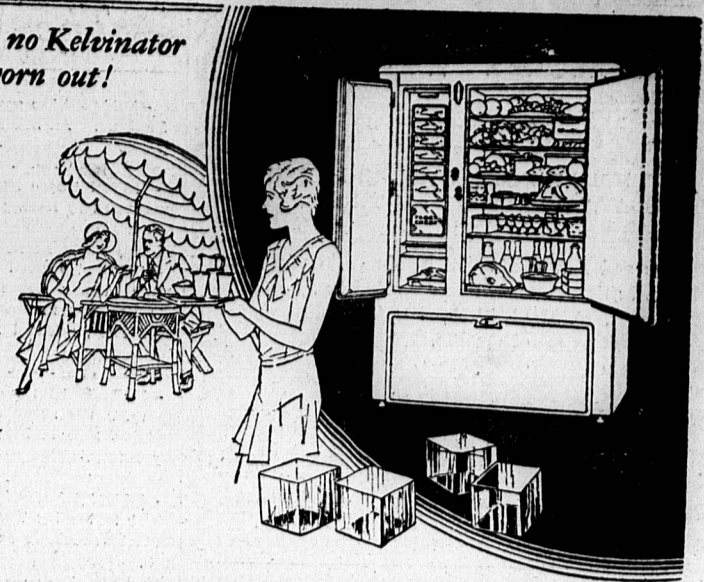
Women are invariably pacifists, Mme. Duray explained, and if they had any power in the governing of the country, they would never permit another war. If women had a say in the French Government, they would see to it that social questions received greater study. Intellectually, there was no question that women were not fit to take part in the Government, she added.

The possibility of woman suffrage in France was not so remote as before, Mme. Duray went on. The Chamber of Deputies had voted by a small majority to grant women the franchise, but the bill had been quashed by the Senate. The Senate was a stumbling block for the cause of women's political rights. Mme. Duray pointed out, because its members were all old, were imbued with the ideas of another generation, and were too conservative with a change.

But if women were not making much headway politically, they were taking great strides in law, medicine and other professions in France, Mme Duray said.

The traditions of France made it harder for women to progress than in other countries, Mme Duray believed. In the United States the men were better disposed towards women's rights, she said, and more willing to let the fairer sex go forth into the world as business and professional women, and even as politicians. In France, however, it was a different matter, and there feminist organizations enjoyed but little popularity among the other sex, and came in for a good deal of ridicule.

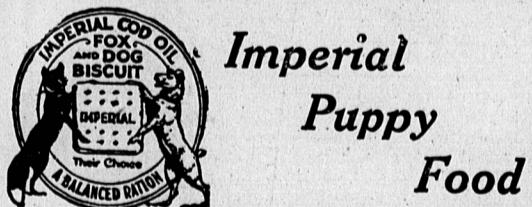
