PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE, Man.,
Jan. 13.-The unlimited opportuni-
ties and native wealth of Canada
were set forth in bold relief in the
address of the United Farm
Women of Manitoba, at today's ses-
sion of the Manitoba "Farmers'
Parliament." 11

Mrs. Gee likened Canada to "The
