Stocks On N. Y. Market Make Steep Climb

NEW YORK, Dec. 9. (AP)—The coal strike truce of Saturday today brought one of the broadest and fastest stock market rallies of the year although profit taking flurries cut many extreme gains of 1 to 6 points.

The ticker tape for about half an hour was as much as two minutes late after the opening and blocks of 1,000 to 20,000 shares changed hands.

The Associated Press 50-stock composite was up 1.9 points at 86.22, widest climb since Oct. 31.

Liquors led strong Canadian stocks. Both Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram gained 5-8. McInivie was up 1-2. Home Mines 1-8 and Canadian Pacific 3-4.

Montreal Stocks Influenced By Upswing At N. Y.

MONTREAL, Dec. 9. (CP)—The truce in the United States coal strike and the increase in freight rates granted railroads in the U. S. and the upswing of prices on Wall Street were reflected in trading on the Montreal stock exchange.

Increases in papers ran from fractions to 4 1/2 points. Getting them were B. C. Pulp, the major winner.

Winners in industrial included Vickers Preferred which jumped 6 following announcement of the company's new capital reorganization plans.

LEAGUE ADVOCATES PREMARITAL AND PRENATAL BLOOD TESTING

In establishing the case for compulsory premarital and prenatal blood testing for syphilis, the Health League of Canada points out that out of approximately 265,000 births in the Dominion annually, there are about 500 reported cases of congenital cases of syphilis.

The League emphasizes that the vast majority of these cases of congenital (contracted before birth) syphilis could have been avoided through premarital and prenatal blood tests. It is emphasized that about 75 per cent of women who bear syphilitic children contracted the disease in wedlock.

Syphilis detected and treated before marriage would have prevented many of these births of syphilitic children—children destined to be blind, deaf or otherwise crippled or handicapped.

So far, only four Canadian provinces—Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and P.E.I.—have compulsory premarital blood test legislation in effect, while none has compulsory prenatal examination legislation.

Ontario, however, has permissive legislation in regard to prenatal blood testing. Through this enactment, every expectant mother may obtain one free medical examination on application in a prescribed form to a qualified medical practitioner.
