LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

MONDAY, April 11.

House met at 5.30. In answer to Mr. Mathieson the Premier and Commissioner of Agriculture said their reports would be tabled as soon as they were out of the printer's hands.

Mr. Mathieson asked the Commissioner of Public Works to lay on the table of this House a statement showing in detail how the sum of \$253.29 which appears in the Public Works report (page 19) for the year ending 31st Dec. A.D. 1903, to have been paid to Andrew Dickleson as foreman and for lumber and labor on Rocky Point wharf, is made up. What part of the said sums were paid to the said Andrew Dickleson as foreman and for what service, what part for lumber and for what quantity and at what prices, what part for labor and for what time. If the said lumber and labor or any part thereof were furnished by other persons, state the names of such persons, the amount paid to each respectively, and the consideration for each payment.

The Commissioner replied that the statement would be prepared at once and submitted.

The Public Accounts were then tabled. The report of the Forestry Commission was submitted and ordered to be published in the appendix to the journals.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Peters the bill to amend the act to further amend the County Courts amendment act was re-committed to committee of the whole House.

Hon. Mr. Peters explained that the act was defective in a small particular. The amendment was for the purpose of stating that judgment by default should be entered "by the Clerk of the Court."

The amendment was agreed to. House adjourned till 10 o'clock tomorrow.

MANCHURIA A BIG THING.

The importance of the prize for which Russia is now contending in the far east, may be judged from the fact that Manchuria, which comprises in latitude to Manitoba, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, and Nebraska, has an area of 302,301 square miles, which is only 10,000 square miles less than the combined area of those great grain states.

Manchuria is two and one-half times greater than California and as big as Texas, Alabama, and Louisiana combined. In the northern part of the province are thousands of square miles of rich wheatland entirely untouched. Manchuria has a possible wheat area as great as that of the United States.

FLEETS OF THE GREAT POWERS AT THE SCENE OF HOSTILITIES.

The naval strength of the great neutral powers at the scene of the Russo-Japanese war is shown by the following statistics, gathered by the London Times.

GREAT BRITAIN. Great Britain's naval strength in the Far East is greater than that of any other power with the single exception of Japan, as the following detailed table of it shows. Not long since the three British admirals commanding on these stations met at Singapore and it may be presumed that they then made preparations for concerted action.

FRANCE. The French squadron is under Vice Admiral Bayle, with his flag in the Montcalm. He has under his command two armored cruisers, one first-class cruiser, and three smaller cruisers, besides gunboats and torpedo craft. A gunboat in reserve at Saigon there are also the old armored ships R. double and Vanban, but they are of no value for seagoing purposes. As a reinforcement to the squadron the armored cruiser Sully has recently left France, and her sister ship, the Marcelline is also under orders to proceed to the station; the Descaetes is also proceeding to the Far East, but this vessel, it has been officially announced, is merely intended as a relief for the Bugaud, which is to return home.
