USE OF PEAT IS URGED

PORTLAND, Maine, Dec. 30.-Freeman F. Burr, the state geologist, in an article on the domestic use of peat which will appear in the forthcoming report of the Maine Water Power Commission, says the attention of the public should be called to the large peat deposits which at present are practically untouched and which with proper management could be made to go a long way toward a solution of the present fuel problem. He points out that peat may be prepared for household use at very little expense and urges that trials be made during the coming open season in as many parts of the State as possible.

andaddock in 1918, prepared for export, aggregated 50,975 cwt.; export value \$458,775. In 1919, 36,515 cwt., export value \$219,090.

Mackerel also show a decrease as compared with the previous year. The mackerel prepared for market in 1918 aggregated 6,710 barrels; export value \$147,620. In 1919, 2,450 bbls; export value \$49,000.

The general scarcity of fish in 1919 was not confined to the coast waters of Prince Edward Island. It was general in the Gulf of St. Lawrence and Newfoundland.

It is very doubtful if the ground fishery can be prosecuted successfully in small boats. To develop the shore and returning to port every night. The expense of gasoline and the time occupied in moving between the shore and the fishing ground makes this method of fishing unprofitable. There are many ways which have been taken do not pay for the gasoline. To develop the ground fishery and make it profitable, it is suggested that it would be well to use crafts of from 20 to 25 tons with a crew of nine men and equipped with four dories.

They should stay on the fishing ground at or about the end of the week for the purposes of disposing of their catch and purchasing supplies for the ensuing trip. This method of fishing would admit of a larger concentration of the business at centres where shelter is available. FOX FARMING

In the year just closed in that unique industry known as Fox Farming, a new commercial epoch has been established.

That an industry has been established by the pioneers who blazed better than they ever dreamed of now an established fact. Looking back from 1875 the industry has been marked by many striking features, notably the mammoth prices paid for animals for breeding purposes which prevailed some years which obtain today.

The year just closing has shown that the industry is now down to a solid, concrete, commercial basis, where the business is based on the real intrinsic value of the commodity produced—the beautiful silver fox furs. In no time during the history of fur farming has there been so much interest taken in this industry as during the past year.—An interest taken because as pointed out silver fox farming is now a purely commercial proposition.

The take-off of furs during the past year together with the sale of some live animals for breeding purposes has brought to the Island, according to a conservative estimate, over a million and a quarter of money. This makes the fur farming industry of this province compare most favorably with our fishing and agricultural industries in their most successful years. The business men of this province have looked into the industry from the standpoint of always producing higher grade of fur and keeping ever in view the idea that the intrinsic value of the industry is the fur, and that therefore every thing should be done with the view of keeping the standard high.

In this connection the Dominion Government had been interviewed by the fox breeders of this province and have asked for assistance that they may be in a position to overcome any disease that might possibly arise in our live stock.

Through the efforts of the Government the possibility of any serious loss from an epidemic of sickness has been greatly lessened. A great deal of study has also been put on

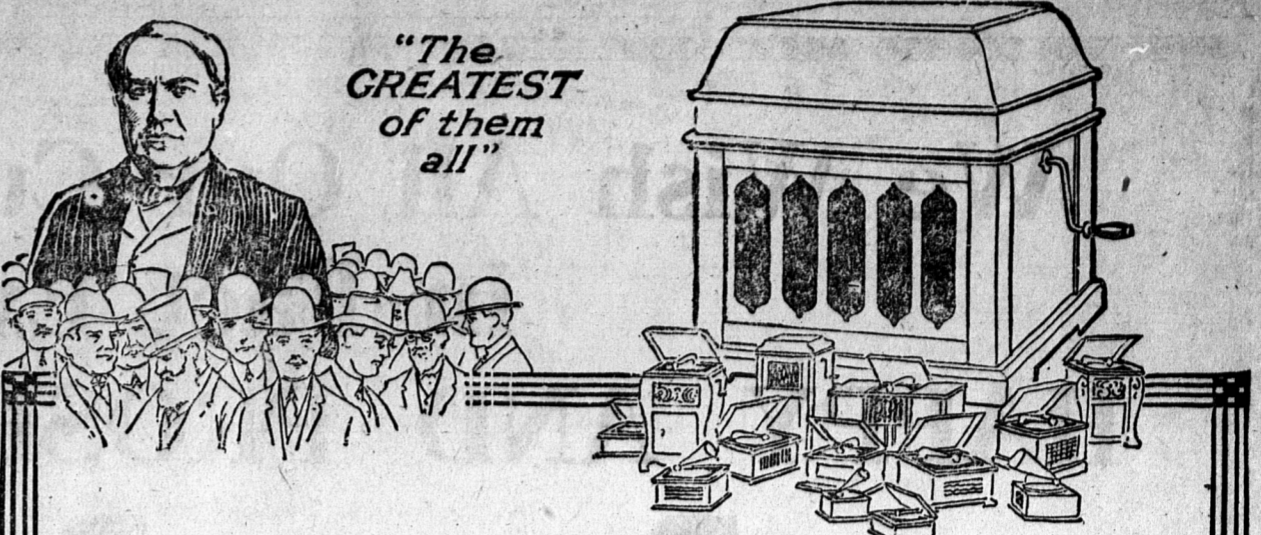
