### PRINCE EDWARD THEATRE

An exceptionally novel and instructive five-part feature was screened at the Prince Edward yesterday entitled "Sport and Travel in Central Africa." This is the Cinematograph record of an expedition organized by The Pathe Company and headed by the famous African explorer, Captain Machiu, with his cameramen, guides and sharpshooters.

Starting from Marselles and arriving at Alexandria, Egypt, five days later the party journey up the Nile River. The hunters first bagged a choice collection of alligators. Travelling inland they visit the spot made famous by Lord Kitchener and Captain Marchand, visiting different villages on the way to the hunting grounds. The life and habits of the various warlike tribes are shown. A rare specimen of monkey is captured who proves an amusing companion during the rest of the expedition.

Leaving the villages behind, the party plunge into the jungle, where many fine pictures were taken of the wonderful birds and wild animals, leopards, lions, tigers, elephants and other wild creatures unknowingly posing before the camera. Many beautiful birds were captured whose plumage is in great demand the world over to adorn feminine headgear. This feature is exceptionally good and well worth seeing.

Two other features, "The Things in the Bottom Drawer," an appealing drama, and the irresistible Billie Ritchie, in a comedy scream, made up the balance of the programme.
